EXPLANATORY NOTES:

SUMMARY:

This matrix is prepared and published monthly, representing what happened in various sectors in the particular reference month. This indicators matrix is a step towards showing a comprehensive picture of the situation in Gambella region and establishing a basis for initial trend and gap analysis. In order to better understand the matrix, following are the explanatory notes on some of the sector indicators:



NUTRITION:

- Recovery rates for Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) in Outpatient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) and Targeted Supplementary Feeding Programme (TSFP) are within the SPHERE standards in all camps.



SHELTER:

- The % of households in emergency family shelter indicates the need for continuous shelter intervention in all the camps.
- 'Transitional shelters' refers to those that have been completed with mud plastering. There has been a significant rise (45) in the transitional shelters in Jewi camp attributed to new shelter completion.
- Procurement of materials for the construction of transitional shelters in the 2016 shelter projects ongoing.



WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH):

- There has been a general improvement in safe water coverage in most camps except in Tierkidi which has a low capacity of storage within the camp.
- In Jewi there was improvement in the latrine coverage from last month. Distribution of family latrines across different zones in the camps remained very low across all the camps due to limited funding. This area requires increased advocacy for more funds.
- The number of hygiene promoters during the month still remained below the standards in most camps except Jewi again due to funding limitation as most implementing partners only recently signed Project Partnership Agreements hence are going through the recruitment process.

Important note:

The indicators for the camps are broadly administrative indicators i.e. the indicators are currently relying on total camp population (entire protected refugee population) as the denominator however due absence of refugees at the entry points/transit centers, indicators were not provided.



EDUCATION:

- Gross Enrolment rate at preschool is still very low at 37%. Parents are afraid to send their children to school due to distances to the Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) centres. The centres are very few within the camps calling for some young children to walk for more than one kilometer. The recent violence in Gambela has increased the fear affecting continued attendance of children at the centres. Partners are continuously mobilizing parents to escort children to ECCD centres and there has been reassurance of protection on the way to the centres and at the ECCD centres.
- The pupil /facilitator ratio is at 84, way above the recommended standards of 30. Due to funding challenges partners have been unable to meet this crucial indicator at the required standard.
- The Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) at primary education is 62 which is slightly above the average.
- Students per classroom ratio for primary is still very high. To mitigate this, double shifts have been introduced.
- Secondary education in the camps is very low at only 7%. Secondary education has just been introduced in Kule and Tierkidi while Jewi camp doesn't have secondary education. Education sector is looking for funds to support secondary education in the next financial year.



HEALTH:

Mortality: Crude and Under 5 mortality rates have been within the SPHERE standards for several months. Good case management by partners for diseases such as severe malaria, dehydration secondary to diarrhea and complications of severe malnutrition contributed to reduction in mortality. Strengthened surveillance and other disease prevention efforts have contributed to early case detection and treatment. However, it is worth noting that all mortality that occurred in some camps may not have been reported, significantly reducing the indicators.

Morbidity indicators

Diarrhea: The incidence of diarrheal remained high in Kule camp due to multiple factors including inadequate water supply, lower latrine coverage and poor hygiene practice.

Malaria: Malaria incidence rates have decreased in all refugee locations and this may be due to seasonal change in the area. The Malaria prevention and control efforts such as mosquito net distribution and indoor chemical spraying were undertaken back in 2015 and have also contributed to the decrease.

Vaccination:

No arrival vaccination has been conducted at the entry points since there has been no new arrivals crossing the border.
