



SOMALI DISPLACEMENT CRISIS IN THE HORN OF AFRICA: POPULATION TRENDS - AUGUST 2011

TOTAL SOMALI REFUGEES IN THE HORN OF AFRICA:




Comment: The Dadaab refugee camp complex in Kenya hosts the bulk of Somalis displaced in the region. This is followed by Yemen and Dollo-Ado camps in Ethiopia. The total number of Somali refugees in these three locations stands at over 720,000 at the end of August 2011. Another 90,000 Somali refugees are hosted in Kakuma camp, Nairobi city and Djibouti.

NEW ARRIVALS IN DADAAB/KENYA:




Comment: Average daily arrival rate at Dadaab reception centres during August 2011 was 1,194 persons, a slight drop from 1,311 recorded in July.

FULLY REGISTERED REFUGEES IN DADAAB/KENYA:




Comment: Registration of individuals was on average about 2,200 per week between January and May 2011. However, this has since improved to over 5,000 per week currently.

AGE-SEX DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTERED SOMALI REFUGEES IN DADAAB/KENYA:




Comment: The Somali refugee population consists of slightly more males in the young age groups (under 18 years). However, more females than males are registered among the adults.

FULLY REGISTERED REFUGEES IN KAKUMA/KENYA:




Comment: On average, 60 Somali refugees are registered in Kakuma camp every week since January 2011.

AGE-SEX DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTERED SOMALI REFUGEES IN KAKUMA/KENYA:




Comment: Similar gender distribution as in Dadaab i.e. more males among the children and slightly more females among the adults.

SOMALI ARRIVALS IN NAIROBI/KENYA




Comment: The weekly average number of registered Somali refugees in Nairobi went up to about 65 in early August, but has since reduced to an average of about 45 at the end of the month.

NEW SOMALI ARRIVALS IN DJIBOUTI:




Comment: In every 3 days, an average of 109 Somali arrivals was registered in Djibouti during the month of August. This was higher than earlier recorded (average of 75 in July).

AGE-SEX DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTERED SOMALI ARRIVALS IN DJIBOUTI:




Comment: Female Somali arrivals in Djibouti are more among the children (under 18 years), while a bigger group of males are registered among the adults (above 18 years).

NEW ARRIVALS IN DOLLO-ADO/ETHIOPIA:




Comment: Although the monthly arrival rate of Somali refugees in Dollo-Ado increased significantly from February to June 2011 (peaking at 24,042 in June alone), current data shows that this has gone down tremendously in the current month and predictions are that it might continue reducing or will stay stagnant.




Comment: On average, the daily arrival rate in Dollo-Ado has significantly gone down from about 2,000 at the beginning of July to about 205 in August.

AGE-SEX DISTRIBUTION OF SOMALI REFUGEES IN DOLLO-ADO/ETHIOPIA:



Comment: More boys are registered in Dollo-Ado among children aged below 12 years. However, female adolescents and adults exceed the number of males in age groups above 12 years.

NEW SOMALI ARRIVALS IN YEMEN:



Comment: Although the number of Somali arrivals in Yemen appeared to go down between March and July 2011, a sudden significant increase with an average daily arrival rate of 130 was registered in August 2011.
