






New arrivals, by sex and COO




Reasons for Flight




New Arrivals Breakdown, By Age Cohort

Special Needs Identified




Notes: A total of **3,946** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2012; with 359 arriving from Burundi, 212 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 4 from Eritrea, 172 from Ethiopia, 1 from Iran, 1 from Ivory Coast, 15 from Rwanda, 221 from Somalia, 2,147 from South Sudan, 800 from Sudan and 14 from Uganda.

507 individuals were registered during the tenth week of 2012 **[5th - 9th March 2012]**; 50 from Burundi, 22 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 43 from Ethiopia, 7 from Rwanda, 26 from Somalia, 322 from South Sudan, and 37 from Sudan. As at 11 March 2012, the overall population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **90,366**.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **3.1** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **42.6%** of all newly registered households.

As at 9th March 2012, the total South Sudanese 'returnee' figure stands at **77** individuals; mainly from Jonglei, Equatoria and Bahr el Ghazal States.

NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
