


Total movement from South Central: * 76,000


Total movement within Somalia: 81,000





Correlation of movements




Between 1st April and 15th June 2012, movements were mainly recorded in South Central with approximately 76,000 out of a total 81,000 displacements recorded in all three zones. Insecurity related displacement increased from 43,700 during the previous reporting period to 51,200 over the past two weeks. Other movement trends include IDP return (8,700), lack of livelihood (5,500), eviction (4,800), cross-border movements (2,900). The movements originated mainly from Shabelle Hoose (44,000), Banadir (10,000), Juba Hoose (5,700) and Bay (3,800) regions. The top three regions people moved to were, Banadir (47,000), Juba Hoose (11,000), Gedo (7,700) among other regions.

Priority Needs



This data has been collected through the IASC Population Movement Tracking (PMT) system. PMT is designed to capture population movement trends, not cumulative population data. Due to the fluid nature of displacement in Somalia and in order to avoid capturing multiple displacements, UNHCR limits the reporting range to a period of three months - these figures should therefore not be added and used cumulatively.
* Please note figures have been rounded using a three tier method as follows. Figures below 100 were not rounded at all. Figures between 100 and 1,000 were rounded off to the nearest tenth, figures between 1,000 and 10,000 were rounded off to the nearest hundredth and all figures above 10,000 were rounded off to a thousandth. This rounding rule was applied to the final result after all computations were undertaken.
