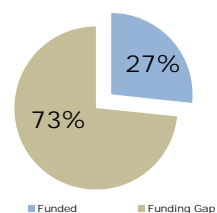


# 2015 CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC REGIONAL REFUGEE RESPONSE PLAN
