




**United Nations Country Team in Turkey  
Daily Situation Report on the Situation Pertaining to Syria**

**July 20, 2012**

It has been reported officially that as of July 20, 2012 total camp population is **43,387** with the arrival of 710 and return of 559 persons on July 19-20, 2012.

Total number of registered persons from December 16, 2011 to July 20, 2012 is reflected below.




Currently arrivals from Syria are assisted in the border provinces of Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Şanlıurfa.

As of July 20, 2012 the city breakdown in the region is as follows:

- Hatay population\* : 10,535 individuals
- Gaziantep population in Islahiye† : 7,122 individuals
- Kilis population in Öncüpınar container site: 11,410 individuals
- Şanlıurfa population in Ceylanpınar: 14,059 individuals
- In Hospitals: 261 individuals (231 patients+30 companions)

Population movement from Hatay to Gaziantep (Islahiye Camp), Kilis (Öncüpınar Container site) and Şanlıurfa (Ceylanpınar), from March 15<sup>†</sup> to July 20, 2012 is reflected below.

## 1. Highlights:

\*: The population of the Kuyubaşı/Karbeyaz, Yayladağı 2 (YİBO) and Reyhanlı camps in Hatay is moved to Islahiye camp in Gaziantep and to Öncüpınar container site in Kilis. It has been reported that these empty camps will be kept for while as standby and there is some use of these camps for new arrivals.

† 15 March is the date of first movement took place from Hatay.

- ❖ From May 24 to July 17, 2012 there has been an increase of 78 % in total number of Syrians currently provided temporary protection by the Turkish Government.
  - ❖ According to Government officials, new sites will be established in the provinces of Şanlıurfa and Gaziantep.
  - ❖ WFP Team is on mission in the region and visiting all the camps, meeting with Turkish authorities to assess the situation the appropriate modality for possible food assistance.
