










Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 06 May 2013, AFAD - Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 193,303 including 405 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals.
- According to information from AFAD during the 24 hrs of 06-07 May, 628 new arrivals Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 121 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria. Despite the decrease in the number of volrep cases recently, It is assumed that one of the reasons of the increase is the registration of unregistered Syrians who have been admitted to the camps for family reunification.
- According to the information from AFAD, the number of medical interventions including the surgery operations (12,575 surgeries) provided to the Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps is more than 993,000. These medical interventions include primary medical checks which is more than 7,500 per day, new births (3,194), as well as the referrals from the field hospitals in the camps to state hospitals (1,105 per day).
- After the incident at Akcakale border crossing during last week which cause the death of a Turkish police, several demonstrations against the Syrians were reported in the national media of which some of them turned into riots and fights between the locals and urban Syrians. Akcakale border crossing is still reported to be officially closed for security reasons.
- During the visits of UNHCR Senior Regional Public Health Officer in Hatay and its towns, UNHCR was informed by the local NGOs that a few thousands of Syrians arrived in Kirikhan town of Hatay. Reportedly the majority are from Aleppo and its surroundings. Local authorities in Reyhanli informed UNHCR that a prefabricated hospital is under construction supported by the Syrian community living abroad. The authorities informed that once it is completed the hospital will provide medical services for Syrians including those living in IDP camps across the border in Syria.
