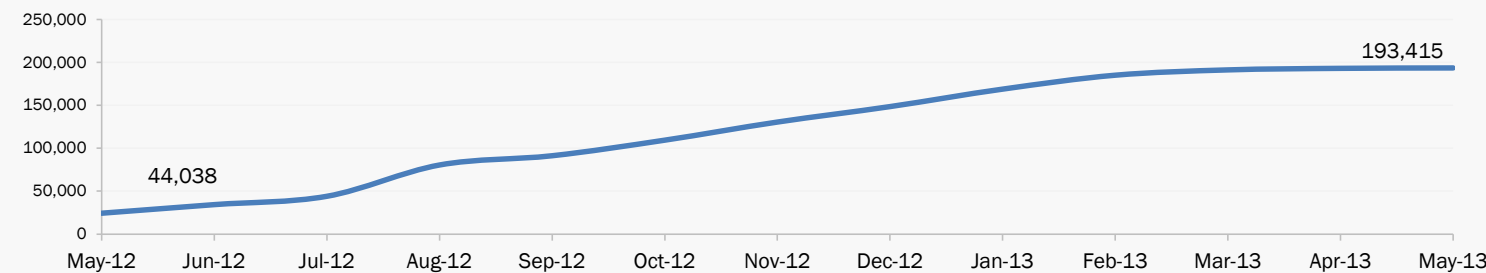
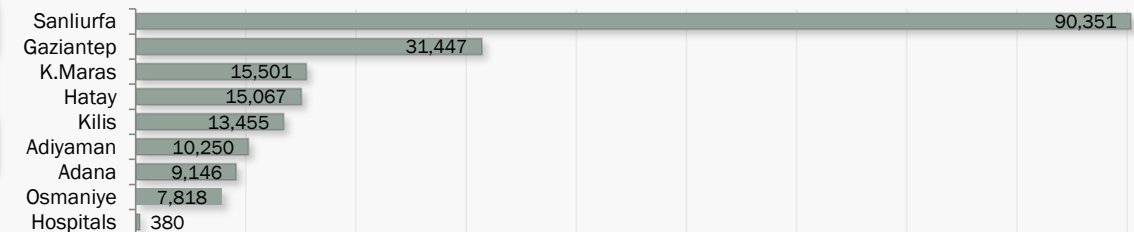


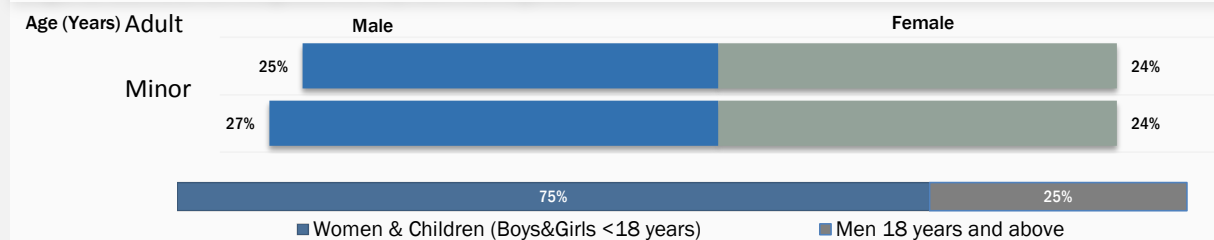

## Highlights

- On 13 May 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces is 193,415 including 380 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. Reportedly during the last 24hrs (12-13 May 2013) 347 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 99 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- After the car bombs in Reyhanli during the weekend on Saturday, reportedly the security measures were increased at the borders as well as at the camps. In Adiyaman camp, UNHCR Field Team was informed that the established an additional check-point some distance from the camp's main entrance and screening incoming vehicles for explosives including the staff vehicles. In Kilis it was observed that no vehicles are allowed to park at the entrance of the camp.
- In Adiyaman, UNHCR Field Team was informed that the camp management is working to establish a youth committee with the young Syrian refugees that will work in close cooperation with the Camp Management and will be actively involved in the management of the camp. Harran Container site example of "Youth Committee" is becoming a very good practice among other camps and UNHCR Field Teams are advocating for the added value of refugee participation in the camp management with all the camp officials.
- Besides education and vocational courses provided in the camps, Turkish Language classes are also very much wanted, especially by youngsters and high school graduate population of the camps. The authorities are trying their best to respond to these requests and offer Turkish language classes as it will enhance the chances of the youngsters who wish to continue their higher education in Turkish Universities.
- In Akcakale, UNHCR Field Team was informed by the camp officials and Kizilay representative that they have received the initial dispatched cargo of the UNHCR donated tents (9 trucks) and the remaining 4 trucks will be received during the week. It is envisaged that all the tents in Akcakale camp will be replaced by UNHCR donated tents.
