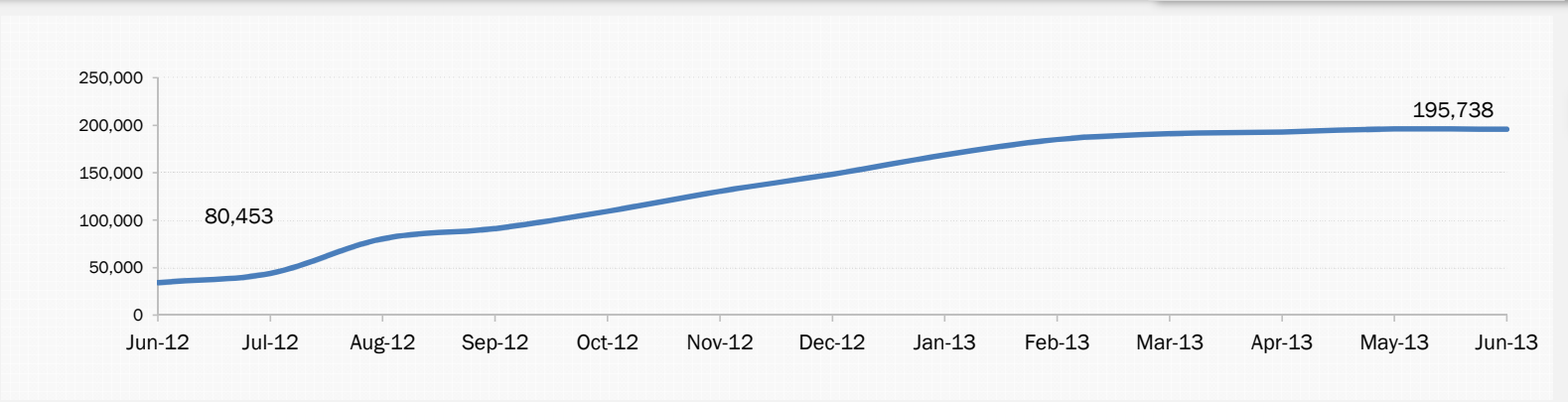
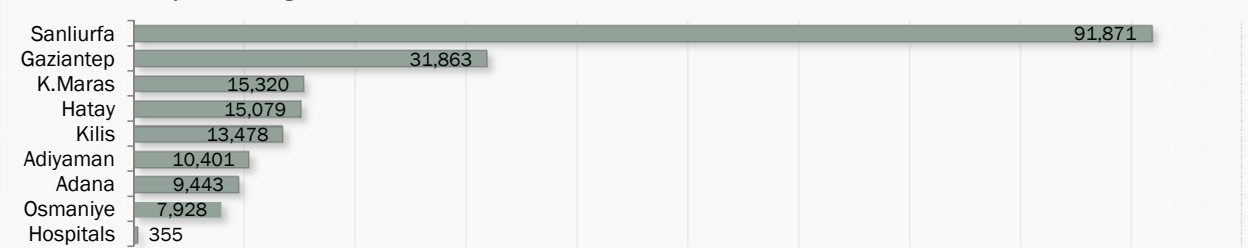


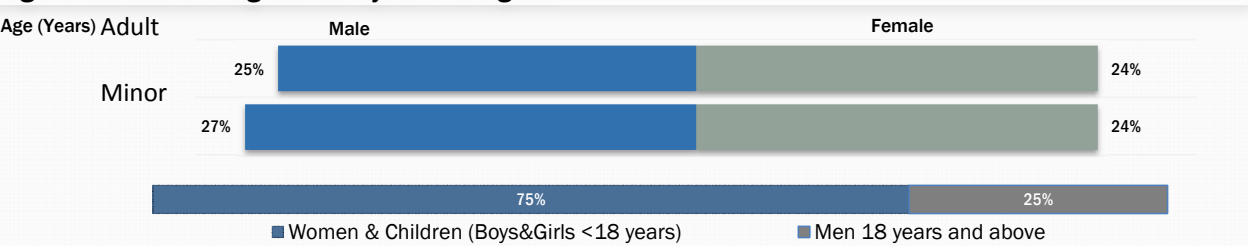

Highlights

- On 02 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces was 195,738, including 355 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the weekend (01-02 June 2013) 865 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 1,291 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Osmaniye province a platform of twenty NGOs was established one year ago to provide assistance for Syrians. The platform has registered about 560 families/ 2500 individuals living in urban. Reportedly the vast majority of the registered people are Turcoman. The platform is promoting a campaign called ‘Sibling Families’ for around 500 families in Osmaniye city which Turkish families provide food and NFIs to their sibling Syrian families and visit them on a regular basis.
- A charity sale was organized in Osmaniye city center during May for the promotion of the handicraft products of Syrian women during their vocational courses. Around 1,000 Syrian women participated in the exhibition with their handworks. Total income of the charity was 10,000 TL and will be used to buy new materials for vocational courses. The camp management in Kilis is considering to organize summer activities for the children when they finish their school term. For this, camp management conducted an informal survey to learn ideas suggested by students and parents.
- As of 02 June 2013, AFAD reported that since the beginning of the crisis more than 1,100,000 polyclinic services were provided to the Syrians in Turkey and 29,713 children are attending to the schools in the camps from kindergarten grade to High School grade. In the camps there are also 5,951 adults attending to the vocational courses including handicraft skills and language courses.
- Protests and demonstrations swept the country over the weekend, however, to date these have not had a significant bearing on the situation for Syrians under protection in Turkey nor are they directly related to the Syria emergency.
