




Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 16 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 20 camps in 10 provinces has increased to 201,091 including 450 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during weekend (14-16 June), 2,396 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 1,198 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The German Minister for Economic Cooperation and Development visited the Nizip 1 and Nizip 2 camps on Sunday 16 June 2013 and expressed appreciation to the Government of Turkey for their assistance to Syrians. During the visit, he announced his Ministry's contribution of 25 million Euro of humanitarian assistance, including 15 million to WFP, 5 million to UNICEF and 5 million to the Government of Jordan for host communities. In total, the Government of Germany has contributed 165 million Euro to respond to the Syrian crisis.
- During the visit to Nizip container site, UNHCR team observed that a group of some 300 Syrians reportedly were waiting at the gate of Nizip container site. Local authorities informed UNHCR team that they will probably be settled to the new container site in Malatya.
- As of end of last week (Friday 14 June 2013), the number of urban Syrians registered and issued ID cards by AFAD Coordination center in Gaziantep increased to more than 53,500 including 11,000 in Nizip town and another 23,700 Syrians have appointments to be registered. In Sanliurfa, AFAD Coordination Center registered more than 9,600 Syrians living in urban areas including the towns of Sanliurfa where they have appointed a representative using the same data base.
- In Adiyaman camp, the female members of the youth committee brought to the attention of the camp management the need to consider the number of females of reproductive age in each tent when distributing sanitary napkins. The youth committee in Akcakale camp plans to implement activities to raise awareness on various issues like training on fire-fighting, health issues, education and training on gender roles. Reportedly there are about 1000 pregnant women in the Akcakale camp and initiatives are being undertaken to provide information on contraception to women. A breastfeeding seminar is being held in Akcakale by UNICEF and the
