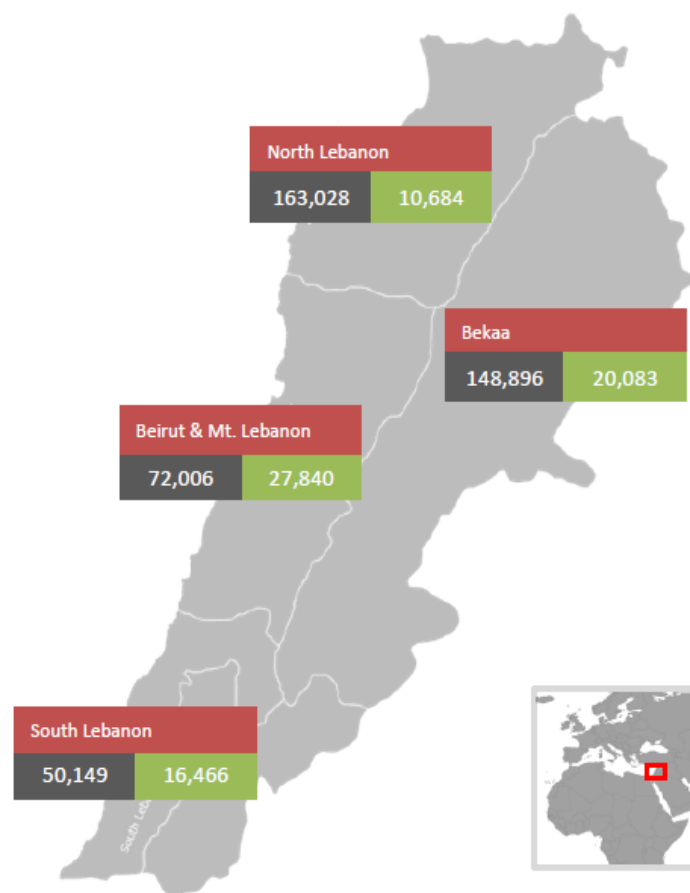

RRP5 UPDATE - Launch

- RRP5 launched today in Geneva with the SHARP
- Technical donor briefing: 12 June
- Prime Minister and UN High Commissioner for Refugees: 18 June

- ✓ Survey confirms that 11% of registered refugees are living under tents nationwide and 22% in Bekaa

I-A Contingency Plan for Refugees [V.2]

NEXT STEPS

- CP for refugee response covers a mass influx (i.e. much more or much faster than projected in RRP5) and also a limited IDP situation
- Harmonised with the UNCT CP, covering earthquake, epidemic, complex emergency (widespread internal conflict or a 'regional entanglement')
- Refugee CP nearly finished, one more round of internal consultation with Sector Leads, Area Offices and Government next week
- Share with all inter-agency partners the week after

→ then preparedness actions need to be completed **before it happens**

SECTOR UPDATES



PROTECTION-Update

Highlights:

Registration: Total number pending decreased to 75,000 from a high of 147,000 in April 2013. Waiting periods now at 15-23 days in all locations. Rapid Registration Initiative concluding and return to full registration.

Akkar: Finalizing TORs for help desks to improve protection activities during distributions. Outreach meetings indicated harassment of Syrian refugees by gangs in certain areas is increasing. Monitoring visits to Arida, Aboudiyah and Baqaiaa official border points indicate no significant changes in movements, possibly related to reinforced presence of Syrian Army on the other side. One-day training for community centre staff on ethics in workplace.

Tripoli: Higher numbers of refugees registered who entered irregularly, linked to recent influx from Qusayr. Clashes in Bab Tebennah-Jabal Mohsen affecting some refugees trapped in buildings. 2-day workshop on Identifying and Responding to Needs of Persons with Disabilities.



PROTECTION-Update

Highlights:

Bekaa: New registration call centre increasing scheduling capacity by 100%. Reported decrease in new arrivals from Qusayr following intensification of conflict on 19 May. Notable movement of Syrians out from Hermel due to shelling concerns. Taybeh tented settlement vacated following security incident.

Tyre: Successful transport in coordination with LAF of more than 800 persons from Cheba'a south of the Security Belt to registration. Ongoing coordination to continue transport support. Heightened tensions between Syrians and host community, particularly around funerals for martyrs.

Action Points:

- Next national PWG meeting on 19 June
- Workshop to consolidate and draft national Protection Strategy on 26 June
- NRC assessment of impact of legal status and documentation



SGBV Task Force-update

Highlights:

- **SOPs SGBV validation workshop** conducted in Akkar
- **Joint Assessment** of Primary Health Centre and Secondary Health centers on capacity to address immediate health needs of survivors of SGBV, including, clinical management of rape in Akkar
- **Coordination:** First SGBV Working Group held in Tripoli + Planning with Mount Lebanon and South teams to integrate SGBV prevention and response within newly established field protection working groups
- **Outreach:** Review of key prevention messages and development of related visuals for mass dissemination within communities



Child Protection in Emergencies (CPiE)-Update

Highlights:

- Establishment of a technical working group on Case Management to support the development of a comprehensive and harmonized case management system.
- Identification of child protection referral pathways in Bekaa governorate
- Pilot of global Child Friendly Spaces training package in Lebanon.
- Initiated process to identify alternative care measures for children at risk

Action Points:

- Development of SOPs on Unaccompanied and Separated Children
- Survey on the capacity of actors working in Child Protection in Emergencies in Lebanon
- Need to raise awareness on managing sensitive protection information with CPIEWG members



SHELTER-Update

Highlights:

- The first detailed site planning for camp (for 10.000 individuals) is finalised.
- 17,164 HH received shelter support as of June 2013.
- New shelter Model to be introduced.

Action Points:

- Two potential sites (West Bekaa) of an estimated capacity of 30.000 individuals are under design process.
- Potential Partners willing to be involved in camp implementation and management will present Concept Notes, base on UNHCR format.
- Several Shelter options (UNHCR Unit, NRC and DRC T-Shelters) will be tested in the coming weeks, through new Formal Tented Settlements up to 20 units each.



WASH-update

Highlights:

- Workshop and revision of 5W (who, what, where, when and to whom) to improve reporting and mapping for sector.
- Water and Sanitation technical guides have been shared with Sector for comments and input.
- Mapping has commenced of locations that are at risk of being deficient in water supply during summer to enable better planning of prevention and response interventions.

Action Points:

- Finalize Hygiene Promotion technical guide to share with sector.
- Undertake comprehensive review of WASH related assessments to date for a consistent country overview of WASH needs.
- Finalize WASH component of Contingency Plan.



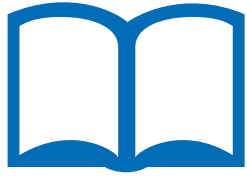
PUBLIC HEALTH-Update

Highlights:

- Coordination meetings: field in the south, UNAIDS.
- Leishmainiasis – negotiated flat rates in 2 hospitals
- Identification of PHCs in Tripoli

Action Points:

- Follow up of proposed JUNTA HIV/AIDS interventions
- Improve access and reduce cost of secondary and tertiary health
- Better coordination with new implementing and operational partners



EDUCATION - UPDATES

Highlights:

- Back to School Campaign under preparation
- JENA Assessment finalized – initial analysis flags violence in schools as a major issue
- Second shift approach: Accelerated Learning Program and after-school support targeting more than 10,000 children

Action Points:

- JENA Assessment Results to be presented to all stakeholders for input
- MEHE to share their strategy for the school-year of 2013/14



NFI Sector Coordination

Highlights:

- Newcomer Assistance SOP finalized & disseminated, with attachments:
- Interagency Newcomers Referral Table form
- Registration Info Note (in Arabic)
- Newcomer HH Assessment form
- Multi-Sectoral Rapid Assessment - Group form (still in draft)
- Standardized Newcomers' Package contents
- NFI Distribution Tracking Matrix

Action Points:

- Area Teams working on area-level versions of the contingency plan
- TOR of NFI Working Group – to be broadened to consider Logistics
- 'Flyer' for donors (& public) on standardized assistance packages
- Still need to finalize the division of responsibilities by geographical area (Geo-Division of 1 agency per 'P-code')



Food Security - WFP

Highlights:

- The WFP Caseload for June is **504,457**.
- WFP (and partner) activities in Tripoli, Wadi Khaled, Hermel and Aarsal have been halted due to lack of security.
- WFP E-Voucher launch is now expected in July, with full roll out in August.
- The data collection component of the Vulnerability Assessment has faced delays due to insecurity in large areas where data was being collected.

Action Points:

- Search for back-up distribution sites to guarantee assistance during periods of insecurity.
- Finalize contract with tender-winning bank.
- Follow-up data collection teams may have to be dispatched to areas of concentrated refugee populations, once the security situation improves, to guarantee full representation of all areas in the assessment.
