

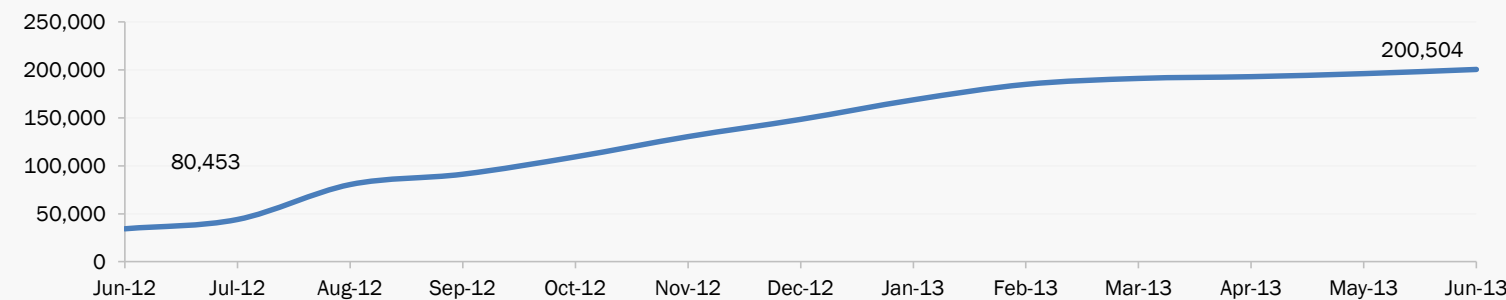

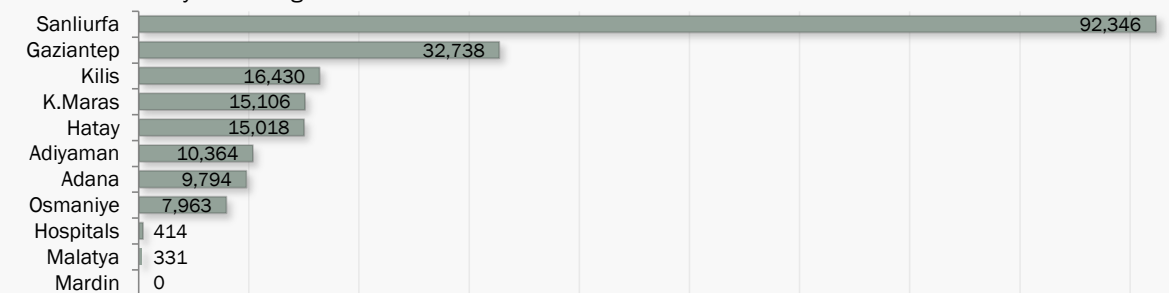

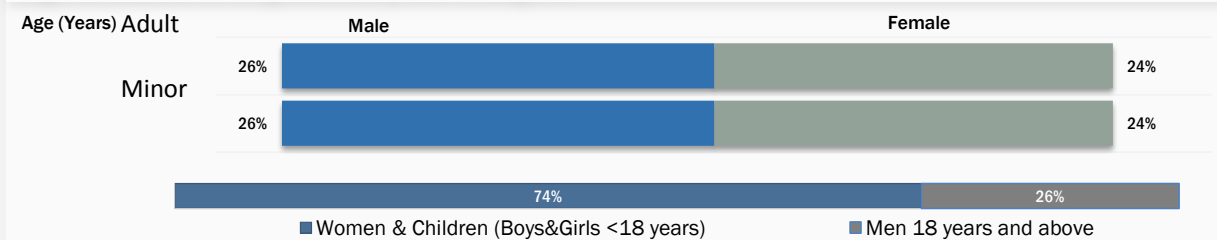

The number of Syrians living in the Urban Area are not included

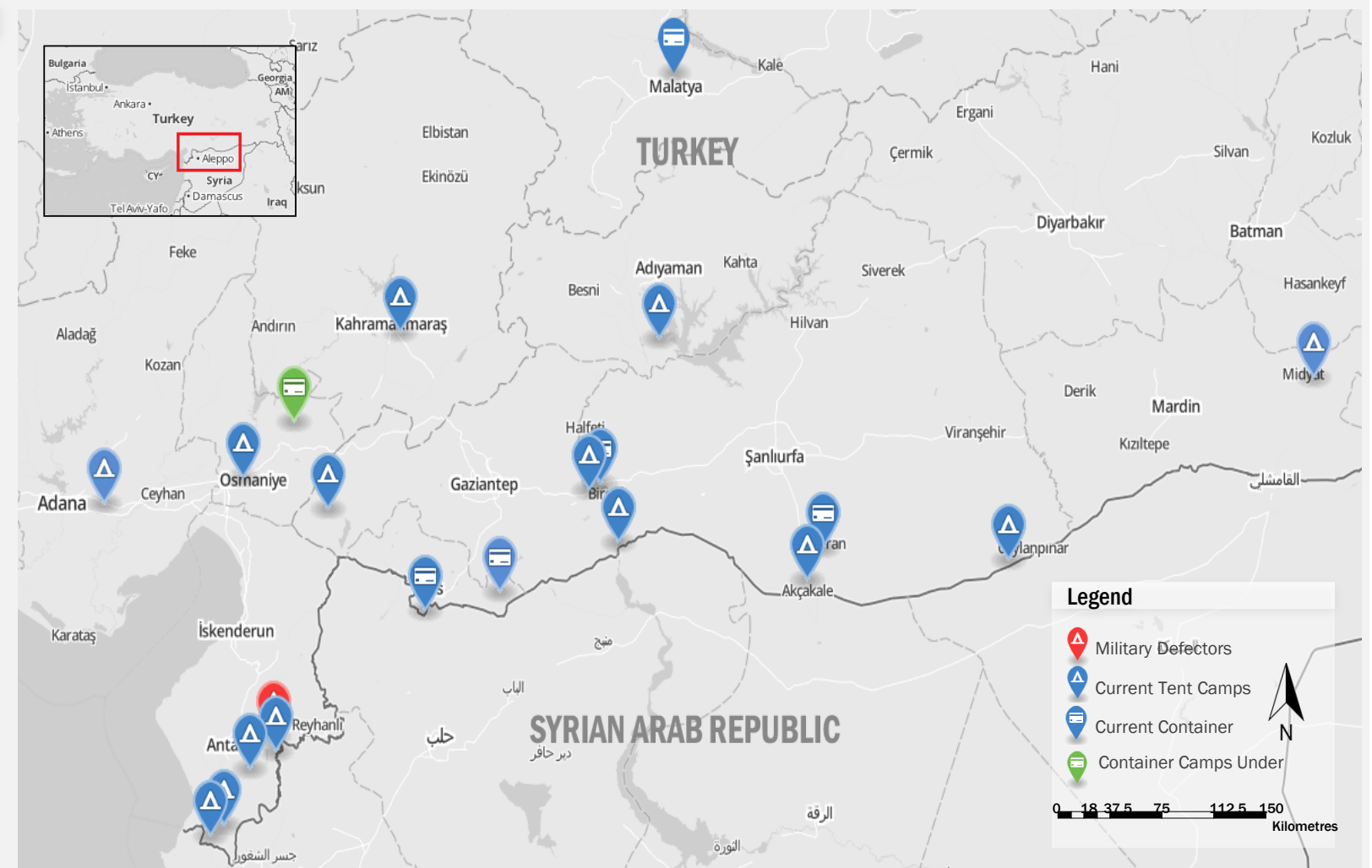


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 17 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 20 camps in 10 provinces has slightly decreased to 200,504 including 414 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs (16-17 June), 849 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 1,436 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- On 16-17 June UNHCR organized a workshop/meeting for all the camp managers, Sub-governors and local AFAD staff working in the camps. The meeting was organized in cooperation with AFAD and aimed to discuss the challenges in the field and key protection issues, UNHCR's role and how to strengthen the cooperation between UNHCR and local officials.
- In Adana Saricam camp, a dental care unit and gynecology unit has been opened within the medical facilities of the camp. There is one specialist working in each unit and the camp management is expecting that these two units will decrease the number of the referrals to the hospitals out of the camp. The camp management is also working in cooperation with the local municipality and fire department to insecticide against flies and possible snakes in the camp due to increasing temperature
- UNHCR Field Team met with the Dept. Mayor of Antakya town and he informed that the municipality has a soup kitchen in town for all vulnerable and needy people and Syrian families are also approaching and on a daily basis about 250 Syrian families (approximately 1250 people) are receiving hot meal from the soup kitchen. In addition to that about 350-400 Syrians are also having breakfast and dinner everyday in the kitchen. The Dept. Mayor also informed that as the local municipality they also provide second hand clothing and house goods donated by the public to the vulnerable and needy families including the Syrians and also funeral services to the Syrians who lost their family members in Turkey.
- The vocational courses provided by the Public Education Department in Osmaniye camp will be ending by end of June. The teachers informed UNHCR team that the Syrians are very happy about the activities and the courses thus would like to have the courses to be continued however they need raw material. UNHCR Team advised the teachers to raise it with the camp management with the support of the Syrians and UNHCR will also advocate with the camp management for the continuation.
