


Highlights

- On 24 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 20 camps in 10 provinces is 200,036 with a slight decrease from yesterday. The total number includes 407 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 23-24 June, 327 new arrival Syrians have been admitted while 343 Syrians have reportedly returned to Syria voluntarily.
- The UN Resident Coordinator, Mr. Kamal Malhotra and UNHCR Representative, Ms. Carol Batchelor visited Gaziantep province on 24 June 2013. The Resident Coordinator and UNHCR Representative met with the Regional Coordinating Governor, visited the Gaziantep Coordination Centre as well as Nizip-2 Container Camp. During the visit, the Resident Coordinator and UNHCR Representative visited with a number of Syrian families and noted the challenges in the urban areas, including shelter, medical care and other needs of the most vulnerable. Mr. Malhotra expressed appreciation and praise to the Government of Turkey for their efforts to receive and host Syrians who have fled their homeland. The Resident Coordinator chaired a UN inter-agency meeting to exchange information the six UN agencies working in Southeastern Turkey.
- In Kilis Elbeyli camp the local officials informed UNHCR Field Teams that some 600-700 Syrians continue to be admitted daily. The groups admitted rotate between IDPs waiting in Bab Al Salame IDP camp near Kilis Oncupinar border gate in Northern Syria and also the most vulnerable families living in the Kilis urban areas. As of 24 June AFAD announced that in total, the camp now accommodates 5,622 Syrians. Thus far, the camp management is providing food packages until the food voucher system is operational.
- In Akcakale and Adiyaman camps, officials informed UNHCR Field teams that the preparation to switch to the food card system is ongoing and will commence immediately prior to the start of Ramadan. A full census of the population in Akcakale has been completed and the supermarket construction is nearly complete. During the census, camp management discovered several multiple registrations of the same person and have deleted them from the camp records.
