




### Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



### Highlights

- No new official numbers for 20 camps in 10 provinces reported by AFAD on 03 July 2013. While the camps population was reported to be around 200,000, as of 03 July 2013, the total number of Syrians registered in Turkey increased to almost 399,000 persons, of which some 199,000 are registered by AFAD coordination centers in Gaziantep, Nizip and Sanliurfa provinces, as well as those reported by local police.
- Registration is ongoing in the two Coordination Centers in Gaziantep and Sanliurfa provinces: in Gaziantep province alone more than 77,000 refugees have been registered, including those with Temporary Residence Permits (ikamets) issued by foreigners police. In Sanliurfa province, some 16,000 non-camp Syrians have been registered by the authorities and the AFAD Coordination Center.
- The situation of the refugees in the makeshift camp in Kilis Park continues to be challenging for the local authorities in Kilis. Local officials informed UNHCR that they plan to move most of those staying in the park (estimated to be more than 4,000) to be transferred to the transit center which is still under construction and some 1,000 (vulnerable) persons to be directly transferred to Mardin/Midyat tent camp. NGOs working in Kilis expect the movement to take place in the course of July. UNHCR meets regularly with the local officials in Kilis to be updated about the government's plans for this group and have suggested a go-and-see visit for some refugee leaders to the respective camps in order to counter possible tension and resistance against the transfer.
- Local Government officials informed UNHCR that some 50-60 Syrians were admitted from Bab Al Salame, Syria, across from Kilis Oncupinar and were sent to Mardin Midyat camp. Reportedly these are some of the same people who had camped in front of Nizip container site and were subsequently transferred to Mardin about 2-3 weeks ago. Reportedly they did not accept placement in Mardin and opted to return to Syria as they were not placed in any container site. The local authorities informed UNHCR that for placement in a container camp priority will be given to the IDPs across the border as well as to vulnerable families who have been living in Kilis city center for a long time.
