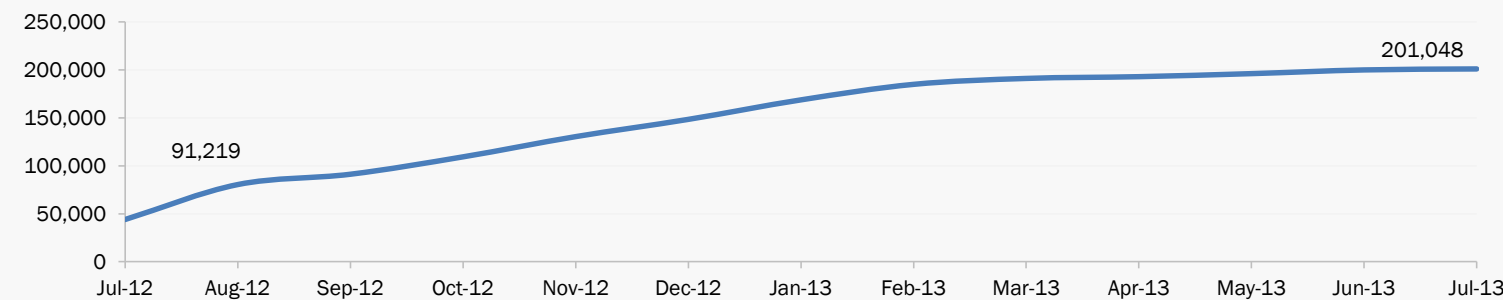

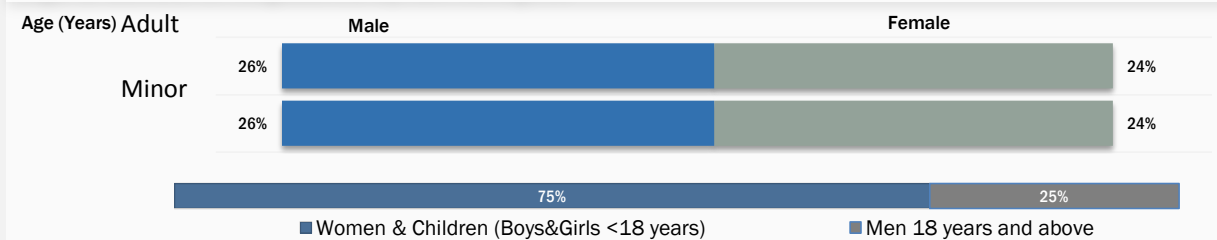

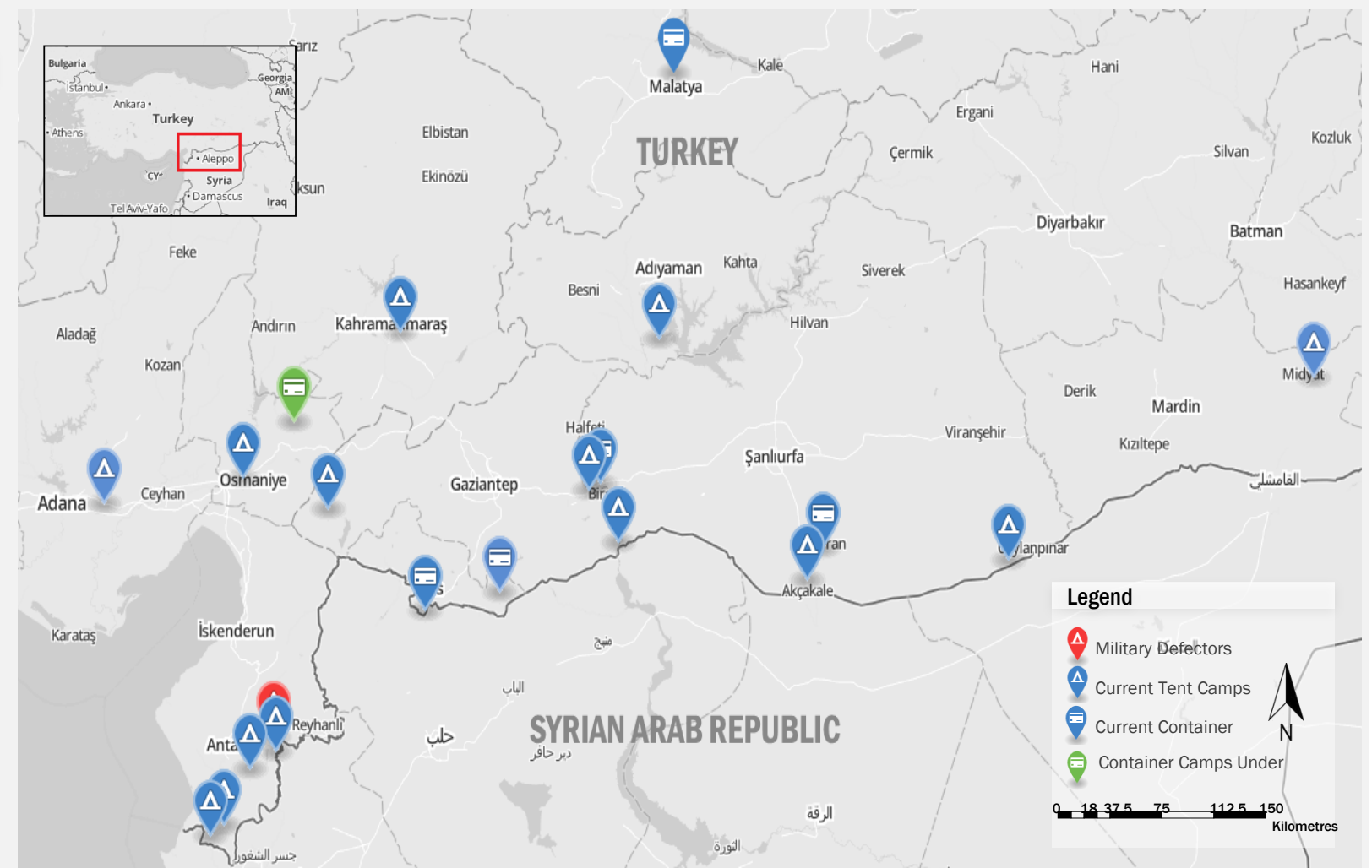


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 25 July 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 201,048, including 543 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. from 24 to 25 July 2013, 414 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 420 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- As reported in the national media, there are continued fights between the opposition groups in northern Syria in Ras-Al Ayn and Tel Abyad across the Turkish border towns of Ceylanpınar and Akcakale. UNHCR Field Teams continue to be in close contact with the local officials to follow up the possible influx to the Turkish borders.
- While continuing to monitor voluntary return interviews of the Syrians in the camps returning to Syria and offering technical assistance in the camps, UNHCR Field teams are also in close contact with the local authorities and the relevant Government institutions to monitor the situation of the non-camp Syrians. The Director of the Provincial Directorate of Family and Social Policy in Gaziantep highlighted the limited capacity of the Ministry in the provinces, necessitating the focus of their work on women and children. A Social Service Centre is planned to be opened in Islahiye that will also serve the camp residents of Islahiye.
- It was reported in the national media and also confirmed by camp officials that a 4-year old girl was hit by the garbage truck and died from her injuries despite all the efforts to rescue her. The driver of the vehicle was detained. UNHCR will meet with the camp management and the refugee representatives and raise awareness among the parents to be more cautious when leaving their children alone, and it will also advise camp managers to alert the staff to be more cautious while driving in residential areas/districts of the camps.
