

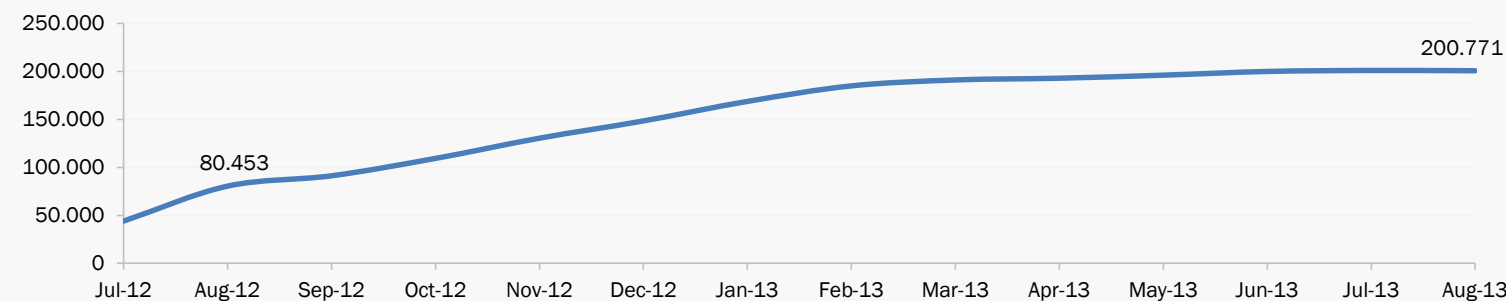

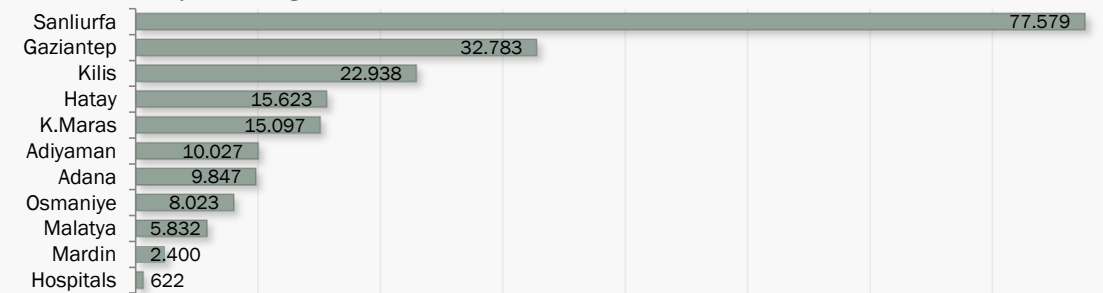

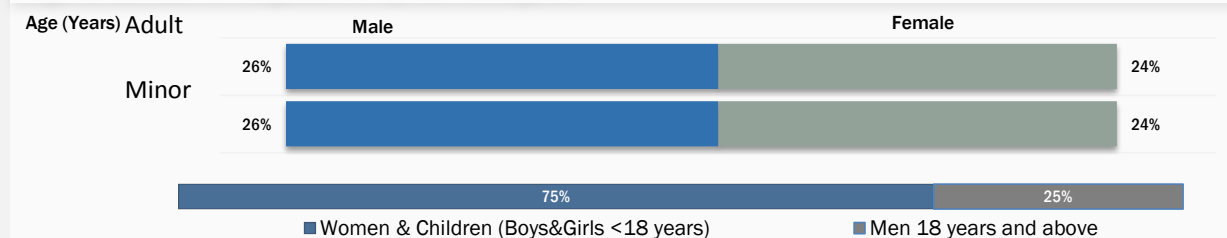

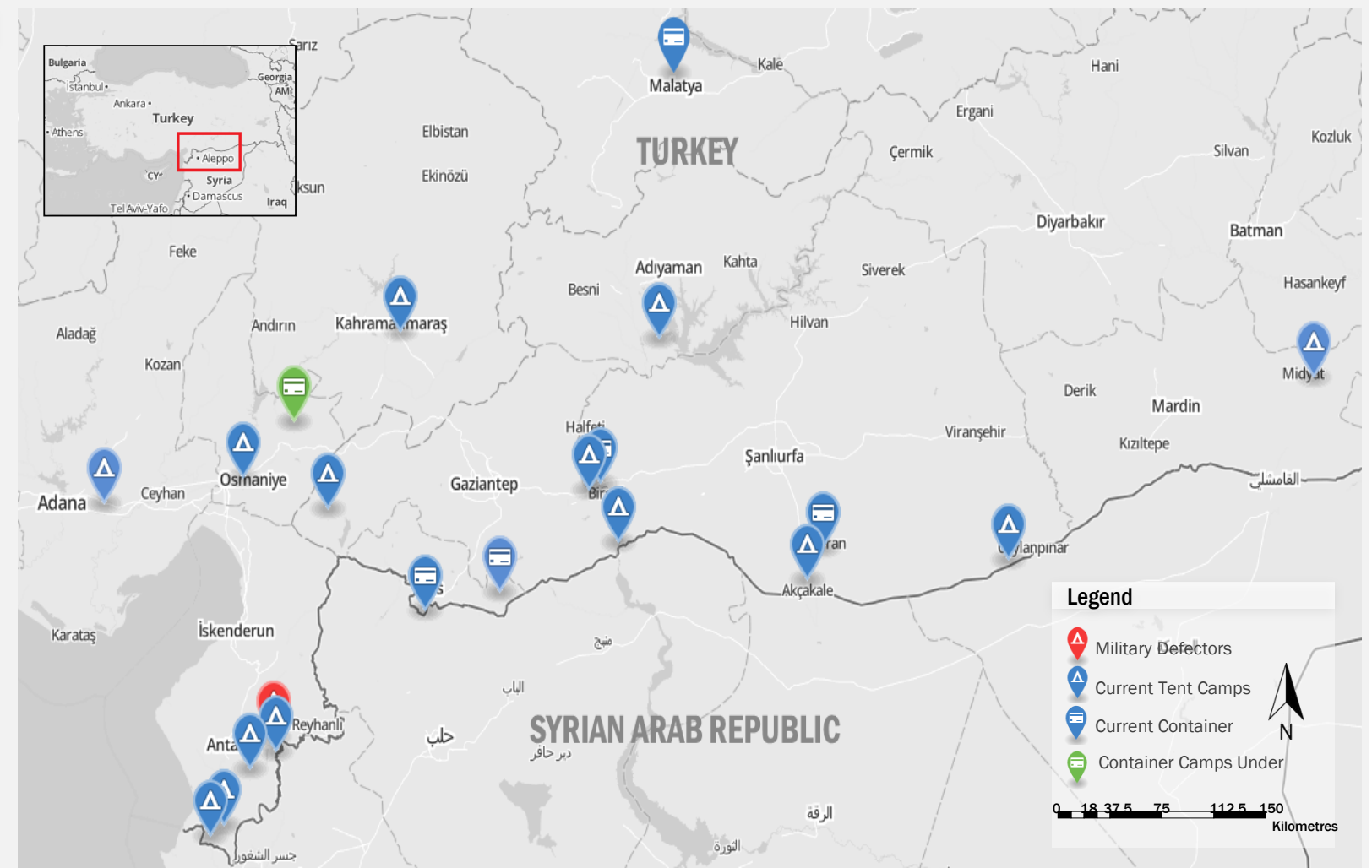


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 13 August 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 200,771, including 622 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 12-13 Aug. 2013, 981 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 470 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported by the local officials in Akcakale camp that some 350 newly arrived Syrians who approached the Akcakale camp gate have been transferred to Ceylanpinar camp on 13 Aug. 2013. UNHCR continues to be in close contact with the local officials in Akcakale and Ceylanpinar to monitor the situation along the border and the new arrivals because of the security situation. It was reported by the local security officials that the situation has been calm in Ceylanpinar during the last day.
- In Karkamis the camp officials informed UNHCR Team that the admission of the new arrivals from Jarablus will resume once they get the instruction from Government officials. Reportedly the transfer will most likely be to Malatya Beydagi camp but waiting for the maintenance of the remaining containers to be completed. As of 13 Aug. 2013, there were about 5,800 Syrians accommodated in Malatya Beydagi camp of whom the majority were transferred from the IDPs in Jarablus.
- In Nizip the camp officials informed UNHCR Field Team that there are a few hundred Syrians living in a mosque in town and reportedly some requested to voluntarily return Syria while some of them requested to be placed in a camp. UNHCR is in contact with local officials and upon request from the authorities a UNHCR Field Team will observe the voluntary return interviews of those who requested to return to Syria.
- During a visit to Elbeyli camp in Kilis, the UNHCR Field team met with the camp residents who raised as their main concern that the food packages are distributed twice a month. Local officials informed the UNHCR Field Team that the food card system will soon start in the camp: The camp residents will be provided 100 TL per/person by AFAD through a card that will be distributed to the camp residents which will allow them to do shopping in camp supermarket that is already operational.
