NEEDS

With camp and non-camp refugee population in the rise, the planned response aims to ensure consistent level of humanitarian assistance to all refugees in need.

For the refugees in non-camp settings, UNHCR and partners will continue doing a regular assessment to identify and effectively address needs of refugee families and singles.

The sudden surge of refugees across the border from Syria on the 15th August 2013 has led to an immediate and increased need in the distribution of Non-Food Items (NFI) to refugees in the camps, transit areas and non-camp settings.

OBJECTIVES

- 1 Population has specific basic domestic items
- 2 People with specific needs assisted

ACTION/OUTPUTS

- Refugees in need are provided with basic domestic items including refugees with special needs

KEY AUGUST DEVELOPMENTS

- NFI distributed to the majority of arrivals into the camps in Erbil governorate, with 5461 NFI kits distributed since the influx of 15 August 2013.
- Planning for winterization support for non-camp and camp refugees has begun with partners.
- Additional warehouse space secured for NFI storage
