### NEEDS

Kurdistan Region, northern Iraq

The significant number of new arrivals has placed immense pressure on shelter and other infrastructure in Domiz. It is expected that by the end of 2013, an estimated number of 50,000 Syrian refugees will arrive to the central and southern Governorates of Iraq, which will place a considerable pressure on the existing camps and also on host communities. Thus more infrastructures in Al Qa'im camps and additional space and land in Al Obaidy camp will be needed. Shelter support for urban refugees and provision of non-food items will be also critically needed.

It is envisaged that UNHCR and other relevant actors, including the UN agencies and NGOs, will maintain coordination meetings in Domiz, Al Qa'im and the new camps to ensure coordination and effective implementation of their programmes.

A key priority is getting more land and construction of additional camps in Kurdistan, in particular the two new camps in Erbil and Sulaymaniyah and in other regions of Iraq in order to decongest Domiz camp and accommodate new arrivals.

### OBJECTIVE

Shelter and Infrastructure established, improved and maintained.

### ACTION/OUTPUTS

- Camp: Emergency shelter provided.
- Camp & non-camp: Shelter materials and maintenance tool kit provided.

### KEY AUGUST DEVELOPMENTS

- The Syrian border with Iraq's Kurdistan Region reopened on 15 August, after which more than 3,100 Syrian nationals fled into the country during a period of 48 hours.
- More than 50,000 Syrian refugees in Iraq's Kurdistan Region since 15 August.
- In Kawrgosk camp, the new extended land area is under development. Qushtapa received some 1,000 people and the Mayor of Basirma started moving individuals from the school to the temporary site.

### ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE



**50,000** refugees have received shelter/tents



**5,554** concrete foundation for tents and cooking areas have been constructed in three camps



Land for additional 8 camps/camp like settings were made available by the KRG



**340** tents procured through funding by the US Government have been emergency airlifted to northern Iraq



Four registration centers were installed/maintained in Domiz, Darashakran, Kawrgosk camps and Sahela border crossing



Site planning for the three new camps was completed



Camp 3 in Al-Qa'im was activated to replace camp 1 and 2 and all refugees were moved to the new camp
