

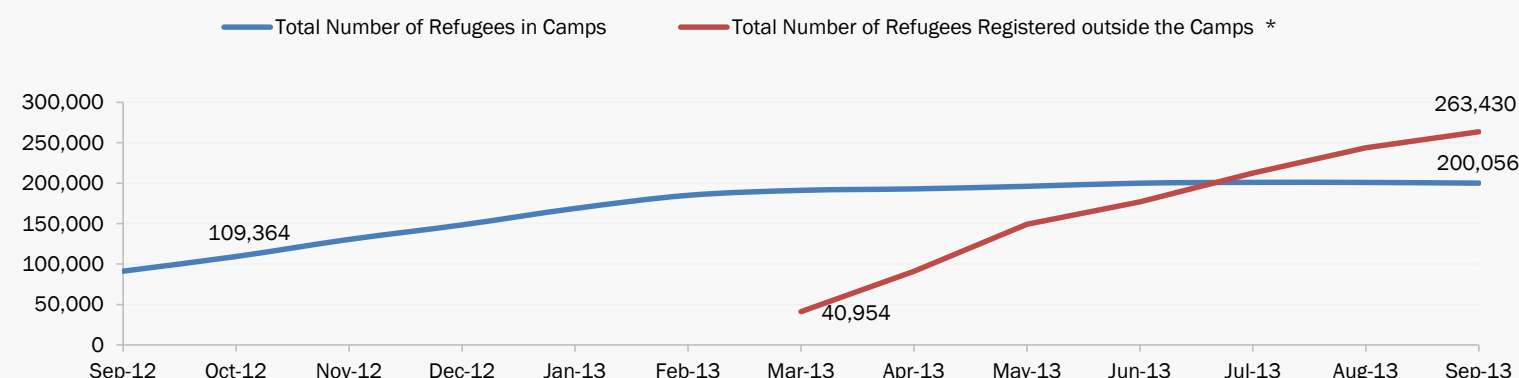

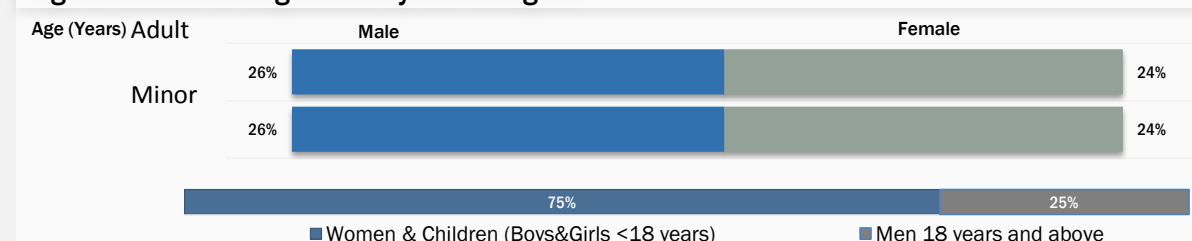

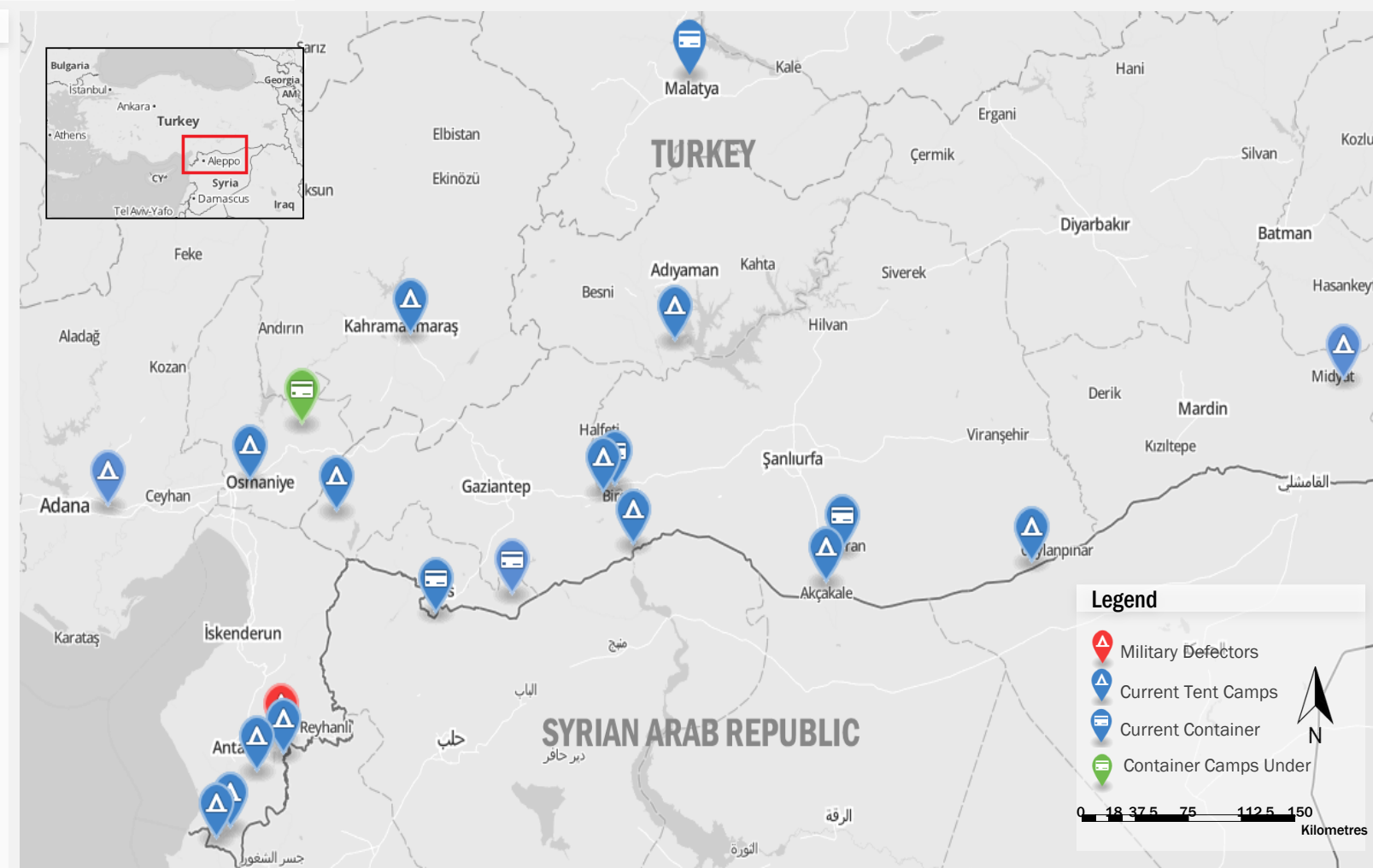

Highlights

- On 29 September 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,056, including 614 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the weekend 27-29 Sept. 2013, a total of 1,544 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,373 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to the media quoting the Governor of Kilis, all non-camp Syrians living in dire conditions in the parks, mosques in Kilis city center will be temporarily accommodated in the Transit Center, located on the road between Kilis and Gaziantep. According to the report the Governor of Kilis stated that "the transfer to the transit center will take during the coming week and then they will be transferred to camps where space will be made available".
- Upon request from the camp officials and in consultation with the central government officials, UNHCR started to provide materials that can be used for vocational courses. The delivery of the first batch of the items which were mostly raw material and/or consumable items for the products have been completed and in the coming days, some machinery equipment like different types of sewing machines etc. will be delivered to the camps. In addition to these items, UNHCR will also provide wheelchairs to the camps where the camp management has expressed a need.
- While continuing to observe interviews of Syrians who request to return to Syria voluntarily, UNHCR Field Teams also provide advise and share expertise on specific protection issues (unaccompanied minors, domestic violence, registration and minor marriage issues), within international law and national legislation. UNHCR Field Teams also discuss with refugees in the camps to understand their challenges, needs and requests and share with the camp officials to find solutions.
- Some of the camp officials informed the UNHCR Field Teams that due to high number of students enrolled in the schools in the camps this year they are having shortage of space in the premises allocated for the schools. UNHCR was informed that UNICEF is distributing 45 sqm tents for use for schools to the following camps: Akcakale, Ceylanpinar, Kahrmanmaras, Osmaniye, Urfa (host community), Tekel and Midyat. A total of 203 tents in all for school children.
- During the educational year of 2012-2013, the TOMER (Turkish Language Teaching Center of Ankara University) program has been implemented in 12 camps and classes took place between March-September 2013. According to first estimations, 78% of students who sat for C-1 level examination are eligible to obtain the C-1 certificate. Certificates will be distributed in all camps the week of 30 September 2013.
