


Highlights

- On 09 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,005 including 61 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 07-08 Oct. 2013, a total of 530 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 526 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Sanliurfa, local officials informed UNHCR that among the 10 towns of Sanliurfa province, Akcakale has the biggest number of Syrians. As of 04 Oct. 2013, more than 12,000 Syrians were registered by AFAD. Reportedly there is also some estimated number of 8-10 thousand Syrians living in Ceylanpinar town. Although not all the Syrians have been registered there, some have been provided assistance nevertheless. A local NGO has set up a mobile bakery in town and provides about 7,000 breads per day and distributes to non-camp Syrians living in Ceylanpinar. In Akcakale the Foundation of Religious Affairs provided food packages to some 300 families (2,550 persons) in May 2013 and reportedly the numbers are increasing.
- Local officials in Sanliurfa informed UNHCR that the Gov. of Turkey will allow the Syrian doctors to work in the camps on voluntary basis. Reportedly the interested Syrian doctors will have to get their diplomas certified by the Chamber of Doctors and submit to the camp manager with a petition stating their interest to work as volunteer. In Akcakale camp the camp management is working on the identification of potential candidates.
- In all camps, the officials are working on winterization of the camp conditions. Some camps have received additional blankets while in some camps the officials informed UNHCR that they are in the process of procurement of some items such as heaters. UNHCR will also procure blankets, and heaters. UNHCR Field Teams are in close contact with the camp officials who will provide UNHCR with information on their immediate needs.
- On Monday 07 Oct. 2013, local officials in Kilis started to transfer the non-camp Syrians in the parks and mosques, to the transit center outside of Kilis city center. It was reported by the officials that some of these Syrians are not satisfied with the conditions in the transit center and so far two families requested to return to Syria. UNHCR is in close contact with the officials to be present during interviews to monitor the voluntary nature of the return.
