NEEDS

Kurdistan Region, northern Iraq

The significant number of new arrivals has placed immense pressure on shelter and other infrastructure in Domiz. It is expected that by the end of 2013, an estimated number of 50,000 Syrian refugees will arrive to the central and southern Governorates of Iraq, which will place a considerable pressure on the existing camps and also on host communities.

UNHCR and relevant partners were drafting the winterization plan for all camps as well as for non-camp refugees. We are also assuming that the current arrival trend continues to the end of the year and therefore we will have a total caseload of approximately 300,000 refugees arriving into the Kurdistan region. Using the previously agreed split of Non Camp (60%) to Camp (40%) caseload, we are planning to support up to 180,000 Non Camp refugees and 120,000 Camp refugees as part of winterisation activities.

UNHCR in cooperation with local authorities (DMC and ERC) is planning and developing drainage systems in various camp locations.

OBJECTIVE

Shelter and Infrastructure established, improved and maintained.

ACTION/OUTPUTS

- Camp: Emergency shelter provided.
- Camp & non-camp: Shelter materials and maintenance tool kit provided.

KEY SEPTEMBER DEVELOPMENTS

- Twenty trucks carrying thousands of high thermal blankets arrived in Erbil.
- In Domiz camp, the relocation of refugees to Transit 6 has been launched and hosting currently 203 families. The site development for a total of 710 families is continuing.
- In Arbat transit camp the gravelling of roads and plots is completed as part of the winterization measures.
- In Al Qa'im winterization measures are being implemented, such as raising tent floor levels.

ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE

57,417 (417) tents were distributed. The 417 tents were distributed in Gawilan Camp.



7,170 (1,626) tent foundation and kitchen constructed.



370 (370) families are hosted in Darashakran and 50 families/day are relocated



244 (244) families in the lower areas were relocated and the topographical survey in Kawrgosk camp has been completed.



DMC/UNHCR continued the following activities in Bajet Kandela transit camp:

100 (40) community tents were erected,

10 (6) Community Cooking areas were build,

20 (20) Family Cooking Areas were built and

25 (25) family tents were erected.



14 (14) desludging trucks were hired by UNHCR in Domiz camp and DMC (under the Sub Agreement with UNHCR) provided water tanks to new arrivals.
