

Highlights

- On 30 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 205,545 including 83 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48hrs of (29-30 Nov. 2013) 1,053 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 990 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- As of end of November 2013, AFAD reported that since the beginning of the Syria crisis (April 2011) more than 416,000 Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and since then 210,000 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. In addition to 205,000 Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps, in 10 provinces UNHCR Field teams were informed by the local authorities that the total number of non-camp Syrians in these 10 provinces and Mersin, reached more than 330,000. Of the total of more than half a million Syrians, 85% are registered in 5 provinces alone (Gaziantep, Kilis, Hatay, Sanliurfa and Mardin), and almost 50% of all Syrians are registered in 2 provinces (Gaziantep and Urfa).
- AFAD reported that as of end of Nov. 2013, almost 1,9 million polyclinic services (average: 5,276 per day) were provided to Syrians since the beginning of crisis. Reportedly 17% of these were referred to hospitals where almost 41,000 refugees were hospitalized. In the hospitals about 32,000 surgeries were provided and 7,268 Syrian children were born in Turkey since the beginning of crisis (April 2011). The camp officials informed UNHCR Field Teams that the vaccination against polio has almost been completed and all children under 5 years in the camps are vaccinated against polio.
- In Adana Saricam camp, the social workers of Ministry of Family and Social Policies are organizing workshops and trying to reach all the women in the camp to provide training on various topics such as communication within the family, awareness against domestic violence, mother and child care. The camp management is setting up tents in the camps for such sessions and social workers requested cooperation from UNHCR.
