NEEDS

Uninterrupted education, including early childhood development interventions, and physical and psychosocial protection remains a priority. Needs of adolescent and youth remain a clear gap, specifically due to limited access to schooling, life skills, and vocational training. With over 530,000 Syrian refugees registered in Jordan, some 190,000 are school aged children. According to the Ministry of Education, some 106,000 are enrolled in public schools in camps and host communities. Psycho-social support tailored on boys and girls needs is crucial to ensure that are adequately and consultatively addressed and help them being resilient and able to learn and play with their peers promoting peace building and integration within classrooms.

The Education Working Group will continue promoting an effective coordination through quality information management as well as through a continuous collaboration with other sectors such as protection, health and water, sanitation and hygiene.

OBJECTIVES (as per RRP5)

- 1 Ensure that vulnerable Syrian girls and boys are provided with access to formal education in camps and non-camp settings
- 2 Ensure that Syrian girls and boys, adolescents and youth benefit from informal and non-formal education services in host communities and camps
- 3 Ensure that Syrian girls and boys including preschool age children and children with disabilities
- 4 Ensure that effective referral mechanisms are in place through coordination and case

KEY DECEMBER DEVELOPMENTS

RRP6

According to the overall assumption of the Regional Response Plan (RRP6) 2014*, 147,000 Syrian refugee boys and 131,000 Syrian refugee girls will be in Jordan by the end of 2014.

It is estimated that 200,000 Syrian boys and girls will require access to formal education while 88,000 Syrian boys and girls will need alternative education opportunities such as informal and non-formal education.

The Education Sector Working Group discussed the planning figures and agreed on 2 main objectives:
 1.Children and youth have sustained access to appropriate education opportunities (ACCESS)
 2.Children and youth benefit from a learning environment that promotes quality education, protection and well-being (LEARNING).

The ESWG also prioritized both outputs and activities using the three categories provided:lifesaving, preventing deterioration and capacity building/resilience.

*800,000 Syrian refugees are expected to be in Jordan by the end of December 2014 (17,8% are boys and 17,1%

108, 046 Syrian children registered in public schools in both host communities and in camps



208 Jordanian public schools supported to increase learning space through double-shifting, refurbishment, and prefab classrooms.



133,700 vulnerable Syrian and Jordanian children in host communities and camps receive education supplies



More than 4,900 teachers, counsellors and education staff received induction and psychosocial training to provide better support to vulnerable Syrian children in schools



25,000 school-aged children in host communities and in camps benefit from informal and non-formal education services.



9,200 young children accessing pre-primary education (kindergarten) in host communities and camps

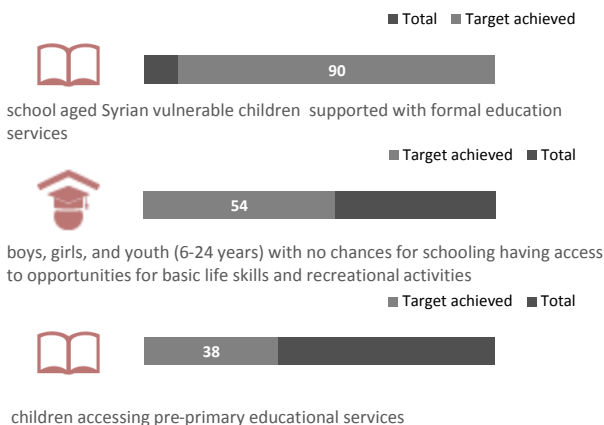
