RRP Health Sector updates (UNHCR/WHO)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The request of 19 agencies had been submitted, 89 million in total requested; four objectives under health (RH, nutrition, primary and secondary health care and mental health)</li> </ul>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>3. Measles in Jordan</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 27 new cases (Jordanians, Iraqis, and Syrians) of measles were found in Jordan recently (22 cases found in urban, 5 cases found in Zaatari). Such number of measles cases was not shown in Jordan since many years</li> <li>• 95% of new arrivals under 30 need to be vaccinated</li> <li>• Measles campaign has been done in collaboration with Unicef, WHO, FFH, and UNHCR all persons aged 6 months to 30 years between 13<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of April.</li> <li>• IOM asked to have a vaccination point in Raba' Al-Sarhan area in order to vaccinate the new arrivals.</li> <li>• Measles vaccination in EJC pending MoH approval. A weekly report will be shared</li> </ul>

Health Sector assessment updates (MoH/WHO)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MoH supported by WHO will start a Health Facility assessment by the second week of May (To be confirmed)</li> <li>• Health Facility Assessment will include Mafraq, Zarqa, Irbid, Ramtha, Jerash and Ajloun Governorates. Health facilities in Amman and those affiliated to private NGOs will be covered later on.</li> <li>• Assessment will evaluate health facilities in terms of the number of the available beds, human resources, type of services provided, basic facilities, staff category and specialty, and the actual proportion of Syrians accessing the facility.</li> <li>• The goal of the assessment is to know the actual burden on health facilities in these areas, and to know who the recipients of the health services are.</li> <li>• The methodology of the assessment relies on total quality management WHO/MoH appeals to all agencies to support the health facility assessment especially by vehicles</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>AP.(1): Agencies requested to support the health facility assessment especially by vehicles</u></b></p>

Camps update- Azraq, Emirati Jordanian Camp (EJC), Zaatari</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• EJC will be opened through 3 phases as follows</li> <li>• Phase one: accepting 5000-6000 refugee in coordination with IOM</li> <li>• Phase two: will start in a month</li> <li>• Phase three</li> </ul>	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• EJC is providing a school, PHC with 10 doctors and dental unit, good sanitation and water, facilitates for cooking and washing center. Families will be provided with caravans. ICRC is planning to have an office in the camp.</li> <li>• Azraq Camp is expected to be opened by the middle of June with an initial capacity of 5000 – 10000. IMC will lead a hospital in the camp in order to provide a comprehensive health services through multiple clinics:</li> <li>• PHC</li> <li>• Mental health and Psychological support clinic</li> <li>• UNFPA &amp; UNHCR to support reproductive health services</li> <li>• Referrals for emergency services</li> <li>• CAMAM activities and services</li> <li>• Save the Children and Unicef will support child feeding activities</li> <li>•</li> </ul>

Sub sector working groups briefing</b></p> <p><b><u>Mental Health IMC</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MHPSS assessment in Zaatari will start in one month using UNHCR/WHO toolkit, and will be conducted on two levels</li> <li>• Community level</li> <li>• Camp Level</li> <li>• MDM north clinic covered by IMC team will be concerned of Syrians.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Nutrition (UNHCR)</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Nutrition working group agreed with MoH on the treatment of acute malnutrition- expedite registering and importing the materials</li> <li>• MUAC Assessment had been started on 23<sup>rd</sup>-Mar</li> <li>• Anemia cases (2.59%) had been provided with a community based treatment by Save the Children, as follows</li> <li>• 25 SAM: were treated in the clinic</li> <li>• 28 MAM: were referred to Mafraq Hospital</li> <li>• The referral system for such cases need to be improved</li> </ul>

Humanitarian Portal and Health Sector Information (UNHCR/WHO)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All agencies agreed to share the minutes of HCM on the Web Portal</li> <li>• The matrix of the different agencies : Health Sector Map, 3 W's, and weekly report from Zaatari-HIS and other groups to be shared on portal</li> <li>• MoH has started a HCM in north areas every other Tuesday (every two weeks) at 2:00 pm.</li> </ul>	<p><u>AP.(2): minutes of HCM to be shared on portal</u></p> <p><u>AP.(3): minutes of nutrition working group to be shared on portal</u></p> <p><u>AP.(4): The matrix of the different agencies : Health Sector Map, 3 Ws, and weekly report from Zaatari-HIS and other groups to be shared on portal</u></p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>9. Partners Updates</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MSF hospital in Zaatari has the capacity of 28 beds, and accepting cases of 1 month-10 years. MSF will discuss with MOH supporting the EPI program in Zaatari</li> <li>• EJC has two hospitals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Field hospital where 80400 consultations , 752 minor operations, 150 children, and 204 referrals took place</li> <li>- Mobile Hospital, had been opened last August where 773 medical cases were treated</li> </ul> </li> <li>• IRD Pending the approval of MOPIC after gaining all MOH approvals</li> <li>• A new NGO-AI Forsan- was introduced as a joint venture between six NGOs. Forsan NGO provides residence and its services (Food, drink, heating, and medications) for injured Syrians, and they mainly communicate with Dar AL-Salam H., Al Islami H., and Aqleh H.</li> <li>• CVT has add another mobile unit to their team where it provides physiotherapy services 3 days/week in Zarqa and Rusifeh areas, for both Iraqis and Syrians 49 confirmed TB cases</li> </ul>	<p><u>AP.(5): War wounded services to be shared by UNHCR</u></p>
