## NEEDS

With camp and non-camp refugee population on the rise, the planned response aims to ensure consistent levels of humanitarian assistance to all refugees in need.

For the refugees in non-camp settings, UNHCR and partners will continue regular assessments to identify and effectively address the needs of refugee families and singles.

The sudden surge of refugees across the border from Syria from mid-August 2013 has led to an immediate and increased need in the distribution of Core Relief Items (CRIs) to refugees in the camps, transit areas and non-camp settings.

## ACTION/OUTPUTS

- Refugees in need are provided with basic domestic items including refugees with special needs

## KEY December DEVELOPMENTS

- Distributions commenced for winterisation CRI for camp based refugees with the UNHCR implementing partners.
- Qushtapa, Basirma, Arbat, Darashakran, Gawilan, Akre and Kawergosk camps received all the winterisation CRI.
- 12 Airlifts of CRI were carried out to Syria ,each flight's cargo accommodates 35 MT of supplies.
