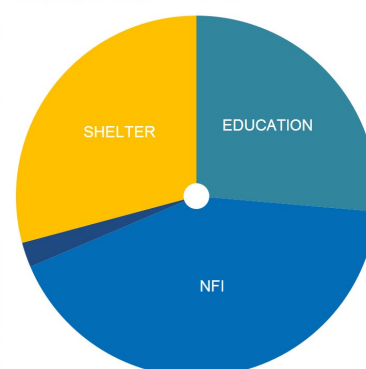
Mission

The Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) is an independent, humanitarian, non-profit, non-governmental organisation which provides assistance, protection and durable solutions to refugees and internally displaced persons worldwide.

NRC Jordan has been active since late 2012 and intervenes in the sectors of Protection, Education, NFIs and Shelter with programme implementation in Zaatari, Emirati Jordanian Camp, Azraq and Host communities.

NRC has played a key role in the development of infrastructure and services in Zaatari Camp, where it is a strategic partner of both UNHCR and UNICEF. For Shelter and NFI activities in the camps, NRC is the crucial service provider for both newly arriving refugees and longer-term inhabitants in Zaatari Camp. In Azraq camp, NRC is tasked with shelter construction, the development and subsequent management of the new arrivals Reception Area and 3 NFI Distribution Compounds. In Education, NRC initially supported UNICEF to establish and monitor formal education in two schools in Zaatari Camp, and has expanded its program to focus on informal and non-formal education components for children and youth in both Zaatari and Emirati Jordanian Camp. In the host community, the Urban Shelter Project targets vulnerable Syrians who reside in inadequate housing, responding to both their basic shelter and protection needs, as well as the upgrade of communal infrastructure.

NRC is the co-chair for the Shelter and NFIs sectors country-wide, and the Education and Youth sectors in Zaatari.

PROTECTION SECTOR

Objective 1: Refugees fleeing Syria are able to access the territory, to seek asylum and their rights are respected

Output 1.4 Access to legal assistance and legal remedies improved and civil registration and civil status documentation strengthened **USD 300,000**

Objective 1: Adequate shelter provided for vulnerable Syrian refugee women, girls, boys and men, and targeted members of the host community in urban/rural settings outside of camps.

EDUCATION SECTOR

Objective 1: Children and youth have sustained access to appropriate education opportunities.

Output 1.2 Out-of-school boys and girls including adolescents and youth (6-24 years) benefit from alternative education services such as informal, non-formal education, and basic life skills activities. **USD 3,000,000**

Output 1.5 Youth benefit from secondary and higher education **USD 4,700,000**

Objective 2: Children and youth benefit from a learning environment that promotes quality education, protection and well-being.

Output 2.2 Quality of teaching is ensured through training of education service providers such as teachers, school supervisors, and counselors **USD 20,000**

Output 2.3 Children receive essential learning materials including basic stationary and other education supplies **USD 770,000**

Output 2.4 Jordanian public schools supported with additional learning spaces **USD 405,000**

NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFIS) SECTOR

Objective 1: Ensure that the basic household needs of women, girls, boys and men are met.

Output 1.1 Provision of basic household items (through material assistance or conditional cash support) for new arrivals and replenishment / replacement for longer term populations **USD 1,850,000**

Output 1.2 Provision of basic household items to mitigate harsh weather conditions **USD 12,400,000**

Additional Sector Information

NRC has positioned itself in Jordan as one of the lead partners of UNHCR and is providing unique, effective and innovative shelter solutions, both in camp-settings and in host communities. NRC provides Shelter, NFIs and NFI replenishment to 100% of all refugees in Zaatari, activities which will be replicated once Azraq opens.

Furthermore, NRC is working with UNICEF to ensure that quality education is delivered to Syrian refugee children and that targeted programs are developed for youth.

Geographic Information

In 2014, NRC plans to intervene in Zaatari, EJC and Azraq camps.

It will continue its programming in host communities in Irbid and

look to expand into other governorates as well.
