BASIC NEEDS



225,548 Syrian Refugees are currently registered in Iraq



NEEDS ANALYSIS:

The priority needs as identified by the Sectoral Working Group are:

- Provision of Core Relief Items (CRIs) kits on arrival
- Replacement of CRIs
- Provision of CRIs based on seasonal requirements
- Enhanced logistics distribution and capacity for Core Relief Items
These priorities include both Camp and Non-Camp refugee populations.

During the month of February, the working group has reached out to organizations that were not participating in the co-operation effort in order to improve the efficiency of distribution.


FEBRUARY HIGHLIGHTS:

- Distribution continued without major interruptions in pipeline.
- The NFI & Logs SWG is preparing a lessons learnt workshop on winterization, to improve readiness for future seasonal distributions
- During the reporting period, UNHCR and its partners replaced worn tents together with the winterization kits.
- All new arrivals in camps received the arrival package.
- There was an increased distribution of kitchen sets due to gap filling.
- Continued distribution of tent insulation kits

FEBRUARY DISTRIBUTION BY ITEM AND PERSONS COVERED




PROGRESS AGAINST TARGETS:
