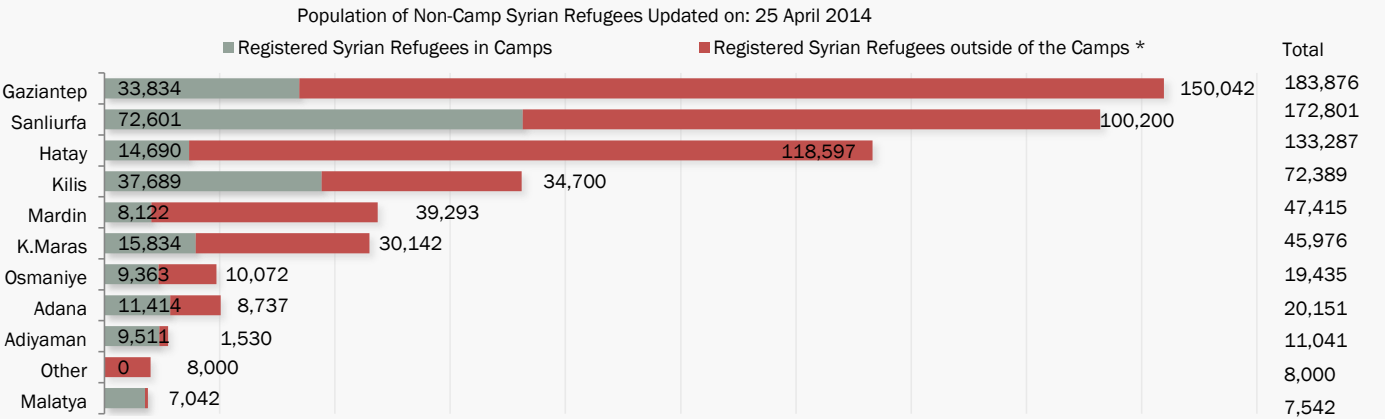
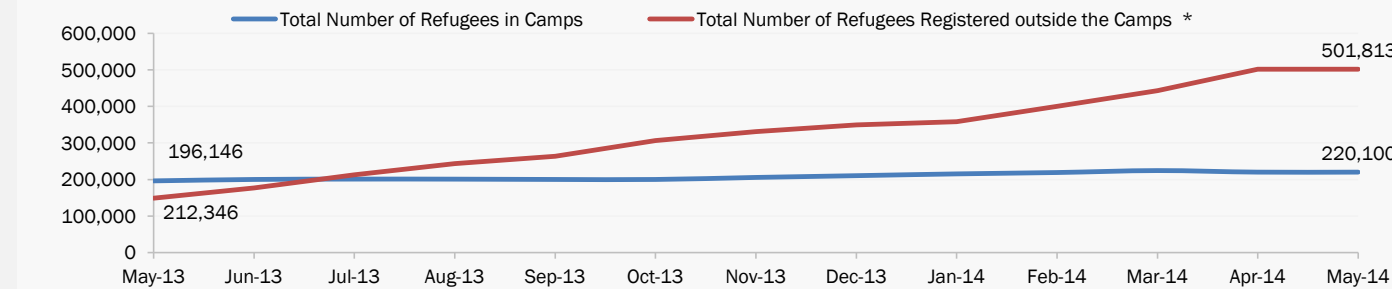

Highlights

- On 30 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220.100 AFAD reported that during the period of 29-30 April 2014, a total of 75 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 378 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Ceylanpinar Kizilay officials informed UNHCR that in early April they have distributed 20 kg flour packages and two packages of pasta per family to about 900 families. Also 1,700 packages of baby formula were distributed to non-camp Syrian families with needs in Ceylanpinar town. Reportedly the donation was sent from Bursa, Canakkale and a private donor in Gaziantep.
- The German NGO, Welt Hunger Hilfe, informed UNHCR that it has conducted an assessment survey for up to 130 families. WHH is planning to distribute three boxes of dry food items to vulnerable refugees (with beans, rice, wheat, chickpeas; in total approx. 60 kg) through Kizilay by mid-May. The NGO also reported that their assessment survey is still on-going and aims to reach about 1,000 families.
- In Adiyaman camp, officials informed that the number of Syrians approaching the camp reached around 60 persons. Camp officials stated that due to shortage of space in the camp they could not be admitted and are therefore temporarily accommodated in the waiting area. They are provided food until they are transferred to another camp in consultation with AFAD Ankara. Reportedly for two vulnerable families (elderly and disabled children), the camp management is in contact with camp officials in Nizip and trying to arrange their transfer to Nizip.
- In Sanliurfa, DRC informed UNHCR that they are planning to open and facilitate an information center in Akcakale town. Through this center DRC is aiming to reach out to non-camp Syrians and inform them about available assistance mechanisms and to raise awareness on protection issues, such as SGBV. It will also offer peer support for vulnerable non-camp Syrians living in Akcakale town.
- In Ceylanpinar, officials informed that they identified about 1,579 children of school age, of whom 351 are of pre-school age. The authorities informed that they are considering to offer some of the Syrian teachers to work as teachers in the school and they will be given incentives for their
