
## Terre Des Hommes Italia

### Mission

Terre des Hommes Italia was established in 1989 and became a Foundation in 1994. It is a member of the International Federation Terre des Hommes, of the Coordination Committee of the International NGOs operating in Italy (CINI), it is a partner of ECHO, and entitled by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs to implement development and emergency projects in Developing Countries. TdH It develops and implements projects to allow for a better daily life for children, protecting them from violence, abuse and exploitation and to ensure them schooling, informal education, medical care and food.

TdH It carries out humanitarian relief and international development projects in the sectors of education, mother and child health, income-generating activities, water & sanitation, child protection and rehabilitation, to benefit thousands of children, their families and communities in 20 countries.

TdH It strives for a world in which every child can grow up free from violence, exploitation, abuse, receive appropriate medical care and study without any discrimination of religion, ethnicity or politics. Its mission is to protect the rights of children in developing countries, without racial, religious, political, cultural or gender-based discrimination.

### Sector Information (Direct Appeal under RRP6)

#### PROTECTION SECTOR

**Objective 2:** Community empowerment, engagement, outreach and self-reliance is strengthened and expanded, and WGBM are engaged in the planning, implementation & evaluation of services.

Output 2.2 Peaceful coexistence with local communities, including through community support projects (such as QIPs and CIPs) is promoted. **USD 71,000**

Output 2.5 Psychosocial support services are strengthened and expanded. **USD 225,000**

**Objective 3:** The risks and consequences of SGBV experienced by WGBM are reduced/mitigated, and the quality of response is improved, in accordance with AGD principles.

Output 3.1 SGBV risks are reduced through WGBM's empowerment and engagement in prevention initiatives. **USD 70,000**

**Objective 4:** Emergency child protection interventions for boys & girls are strengthened & harmonized.

Output 4.1 Capacity development and collaboration with relevant stakeholders is strengthened, including through the mainstreaming of child protection into other humanitarian response sectors. **USD 45,000**

Output 4.2 CP prevention activities are increased, including through the strengthening of CBCPCs and other community structures. **USD 85,000**

### EDUCATION SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Children and youth have sustained access to appropriate education opportunities.

Output 1.1 School aged Syrian boys and girls benefit from formal education (primary and secondary) **USD 64,000**

Output 1.2 Out of school boys and girls including adolescents and youth (6-24 years) benefit from alternative education services such as informal, non-formal education, and basic life skills activities. **USD 150,000**

**Objective 2:** Children and youth benefit from a learning environment that promotes quality education, protection and well-being.

Output 2.3 Children receive essential learning materials including basic stationary and other education supplies. **USD 155,000**

### HEALTH SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Improve equitable access, quality and coverage to comprehensive primary health care for Syrian refugee women, girls, boys and men in Jordan by end of 2014.

Output 1.2 Comprehensive reproductive health services provided to Syrian refugees and affected Jordanian population. **USD 100,000**

Output 1.5 Improve access to mental health services at the primary health level. **USD 82,000**

**Objective 3:** Support the capacity of the national health care system to provide services to Syrian women, girls, boys and men and vulnerable Jordanians in the most affected areas by the end of 2014.

Output 3.1 Access to primary and essential secondary and tertiary health care supported. **USD 37,000**

**Objective 4:** Improve coverage of comprehensive health and rehabilitation services to Syrian refugees through integrated community level interventions by end of 2014.

Output 4.2 Community level referral system in place. **USD 36,000**

### NFI SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Ensure that the basic HH need of MWBG are met.

Output 1.2 Provision of basic HH items to mitigate harsh weather conditions. **USD 66,000**

Output 1.3 Essential sanitary items provided. **USD 256,000**

#### **Additional Sector Information**

In 2014, TdH It aims to implement projects in Jordan in the sectors of child protection, education, gender-based violence, and psychosocial support, whilst distributing non-food items in vulnerable communities.

#### **Geographic Focus**

In 2014, TdH It plans to intervene in Aqaba, Tafilah and Zarqa Governorates. In Aqaba, the poorest neighborhoods of Aqaba city will be addressed, namely Al Mahdode, Al Rimal, Al Shalala, Al Sadis, Al Thamin, and Wahdat Sharqiyya. In Tafila, the areas that will be targeted are those of Ein al Beida and Tafela Wadi Zaid.
