



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>765,113</b>

## Highlights

- On 03 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,003. AFAD reported that during the period of 02-03 June 2014, a total of 90 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 346 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that, as per instruction from AFAD Hq., they have transferred 21 Palestinians who were waiting at the gate of Viransehir camp to Nusaybin camp on 2 June. The camp officials in Nusaybin confirmed the arrival of the group and reported that they were registered and accommodated in the camp the following day.
- In Adana, officials have reported that, as the police continue to register non-camp Syrians, they also assign interview appointment dates. Due to high number of non-camp Syrians, it is reported that as of end of May, the earliest appointment dates available are for March 2015. Officials also reported that the number of registered non-camp Syrians has reached over 7,500 persons, about 300 of whom have been registered at the registration unit within the camp.
- In Adana, officials informed UNHCR that during the registration of non-camp Syrians, they have come across a number of cases that have already been registered in another city or within a camp (approximately 30 such cases per day). The officials informed UNHCR that these individuals are given the option of returning to their previous location or changing their place of residence to Adana, and their case files are updated accordingly. Additionally, it is reported that ID cards are printed and delivered to the beneficiaries the day after their registration.
- In Akcakale, the registration of non-camp Syrians has thus far been conducted by police within the camp registration centers. However, officials informed UNHCR that as of 2 June, police have started to register non-camp Syrians in the police station in Akcakale town instead. It was reported that as of the end of May, about 24,000 non-camp Syrians have been recorded by AFAD while the police have started to re-register those who were registered before, as well as new arrivals who come to the police station for registration.
