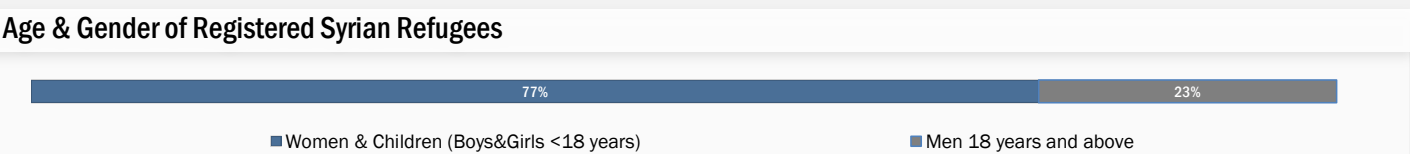
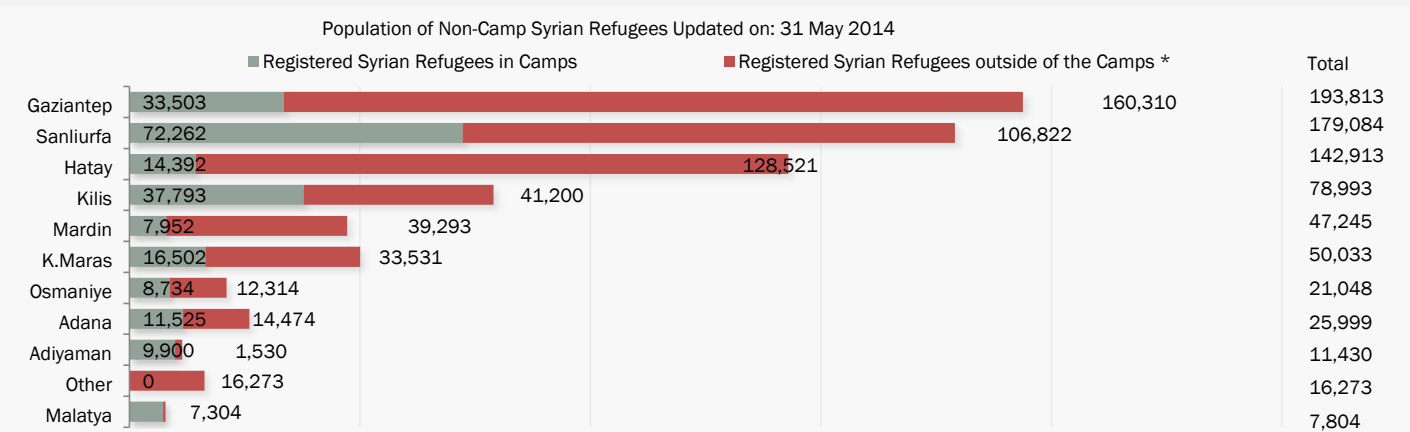
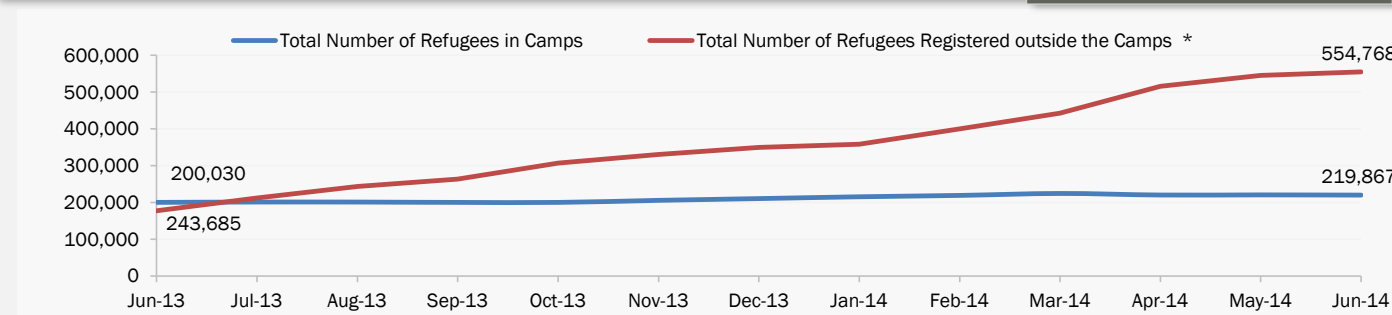

Highlights

- On 08 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,867. AFAD reported that during the period of 06-08 June 2014, a total of 774 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 595 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to information from AFAD, almost 2.9 million polyclinic services have been provided to Syrians since the beginning of the refugee crisis. About 15% of these cases were referred to various hospitals and about 14% of these referrals were for inpatient hospitalizations. As of June 2014, almost 48,000 surgeries have been performed on Syrians. AFAD also reported that 12,928 Syrian children have been born in Turkey since the beginning of the crisis.
- AFAD reported in its daily information note on 08 June that, in addition to the more than 68,000 children are attending schools in the camps in all grades (1st-12th grade), there are also more than 9,500 adults attending more than 150 vocational courses and language classes. It is reported that almost 26,000 adults have already completed the vocational courses provided in the camps since the beginning of the crisis.
- In Reyhanli town of Hatay province, a UNHCR field team visited a clinic that has been operational for the passed 6 months. The clinic is partially funded by IMC and hosts four psychosocial support staff who are employed and paid by IMC. It is reported that IMC also pays the rent for the clinic building and covers the cost of the medication for the psychosocial support unit. IMC informed UNHCR that during the 6 months since the clinic became operational, about 123 Syrians, 62 of whom are children of different ages, have benefitted from the services.
- In Akcakale camp, officials informed UNHCR that there are about 90 Syrians, 70 of whom are women and children, temporarily accommodated in the camp waiting area due to shortages in the capacity of the camp. A UNHCR field team discussed the situation with provincial officials of AFAD, who will be assessing the situation and will try to get these people transferred to another camp where space is available.
