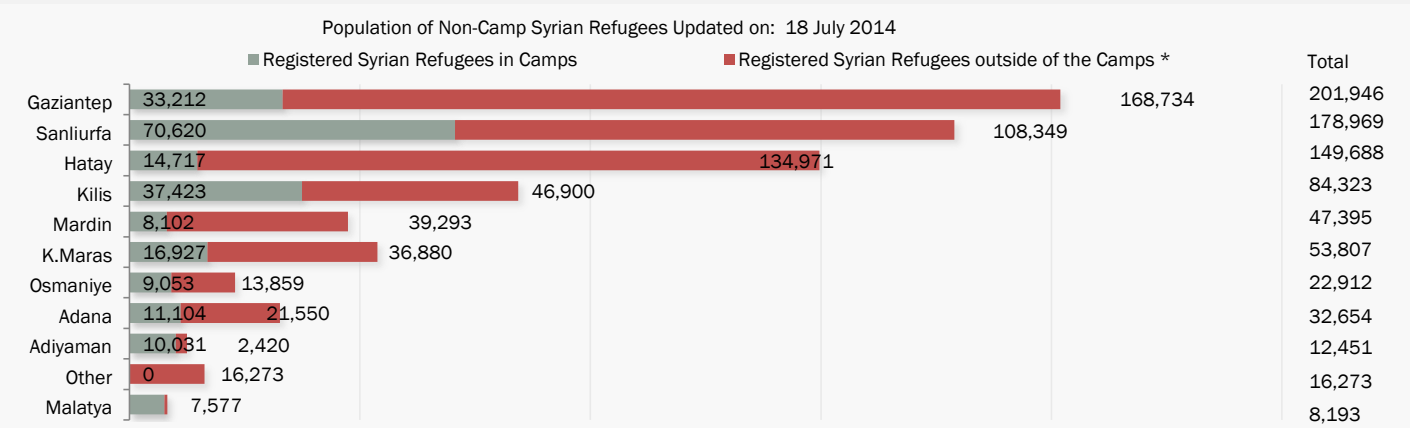
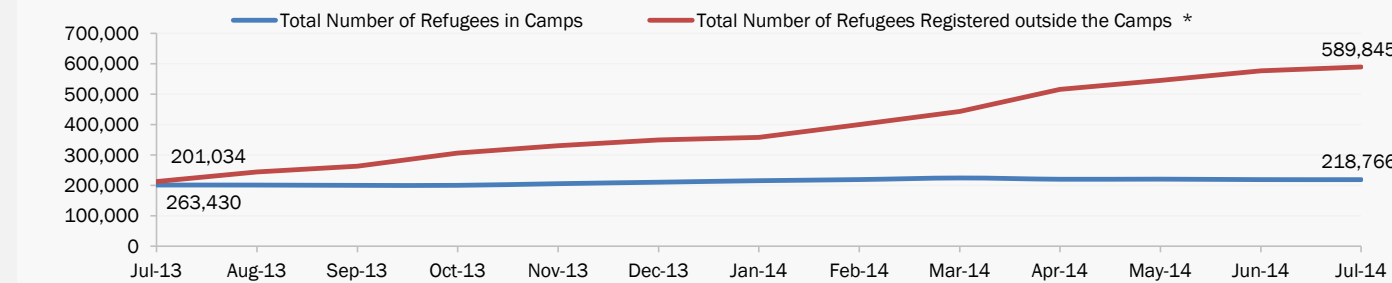


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	808,611

## Highlights

- On 21 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,766. AFAD reported that during the period of 20-21 July 2014, a total of 44 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 364 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Mardin Midyat camp, the officials informed that a philanthropist donated 100 TL per person to the camp residents and the amount was distributed to each camp residents on 21 July 2014. The camp officials stated that the same person did the same distribution during the Eid Al Fitr in 2013 as well. The camp management also informed that they have started new vocational course in the camp as of first week of July 2014 and the course will be provided during the day.
- In Birecik town of Sanliurfa province, Turkish Red Crescent (Kizilay) informed that in addition to the tent established for the local residents by the authorities, they have established a big tent in the town center for non-camp Syrians living in town to serve hot meal for iftar (fast breaking dinner) for up to 1,100 persons a day. Local officials informed that AFAD registered about 6,500 non-camp Syrians living in Birecik town.
- During last week, Ministry of Health and UNHCR technical staff organized an assessment visit to the clinics that are still under construction. The mission visited 7 constructions sites in Sanliurfa (4), Mardin (1), Adiyaman (1), and Gaziantep (1) out of 10 health facilities that are being built funded by UNHCR to support the Government of Turkey to respond the medical services provided to the Syrian refugees in the camps and non-camp settings. It was observed that 50% of the construction in these sites are completed.
- The provincial office of the Turkish Red Crescent (Kizilay) in Antakya/Hatay informed that depending on the donations they receive from the private donors, they provide food and non-food items to the non-camp Syrians living in town. The Kizilay officials informed that they are in close contact with the local NGOs operating in various districts and they do the distribution through the volunteers of the local NGOs. Officials also inform that they keep the list of the
