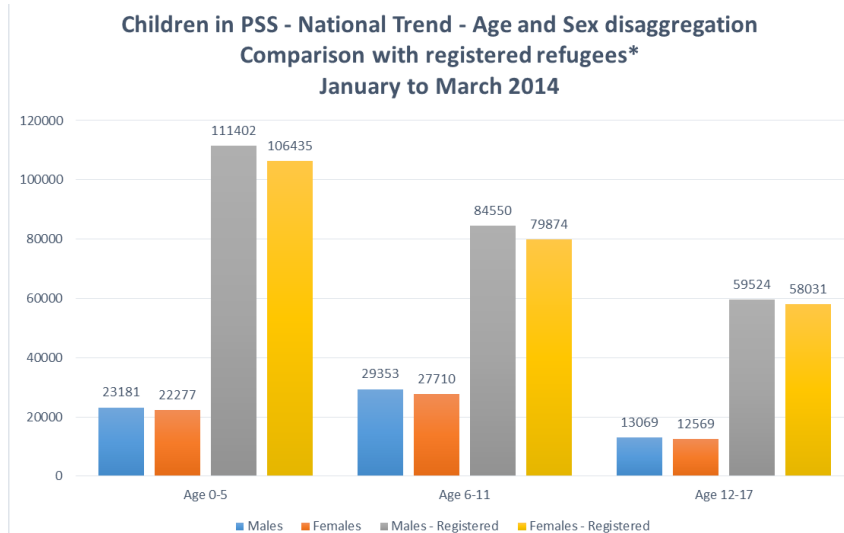

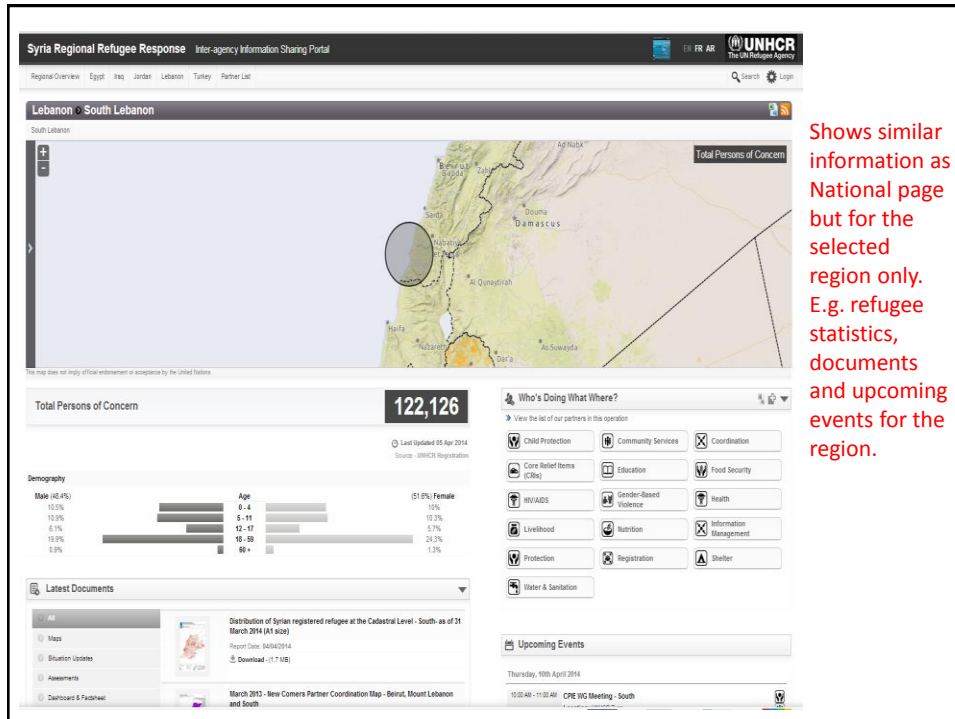

RRP6 MYR: Priorities

Overall, the priority areas identified in the RRP6 remain the same, with an emphasis on working with refugee and host communities towards strengthening community-based linkages and protection mechanisms for children.



RRP6 MYR: Priorities

The four main areas of work for June-December 2014 include:

- Provision of psychosocial support to girls, boys, and caregivers across the country as an entry point towards mitigating the impact of the conflict and supporting resilience.
- Strengthening of case management system to ensure timely referral and response to children at high risk of violence and abuse, such as children formerly associated with armed groups, child survivors of GBV, separated and unaccompanied children, children engaged in the worst forms of child labour, and the provision of specialized services.



RRP6 MYR: Priorities

- Establishment of alternative care in emergency settings, such as family and community-based care arrangements for vulnerable and high-risk children, including unaccompanied children.
- Continuation of capacity development initiatives to equip key child protection actors, particularly social workers, and stakeholders, such as government and municipal authorities, with specialized skills to improve child protection in emergencies interventions.
