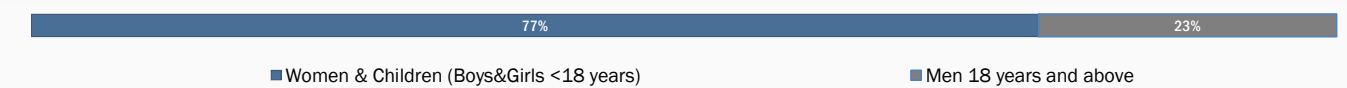

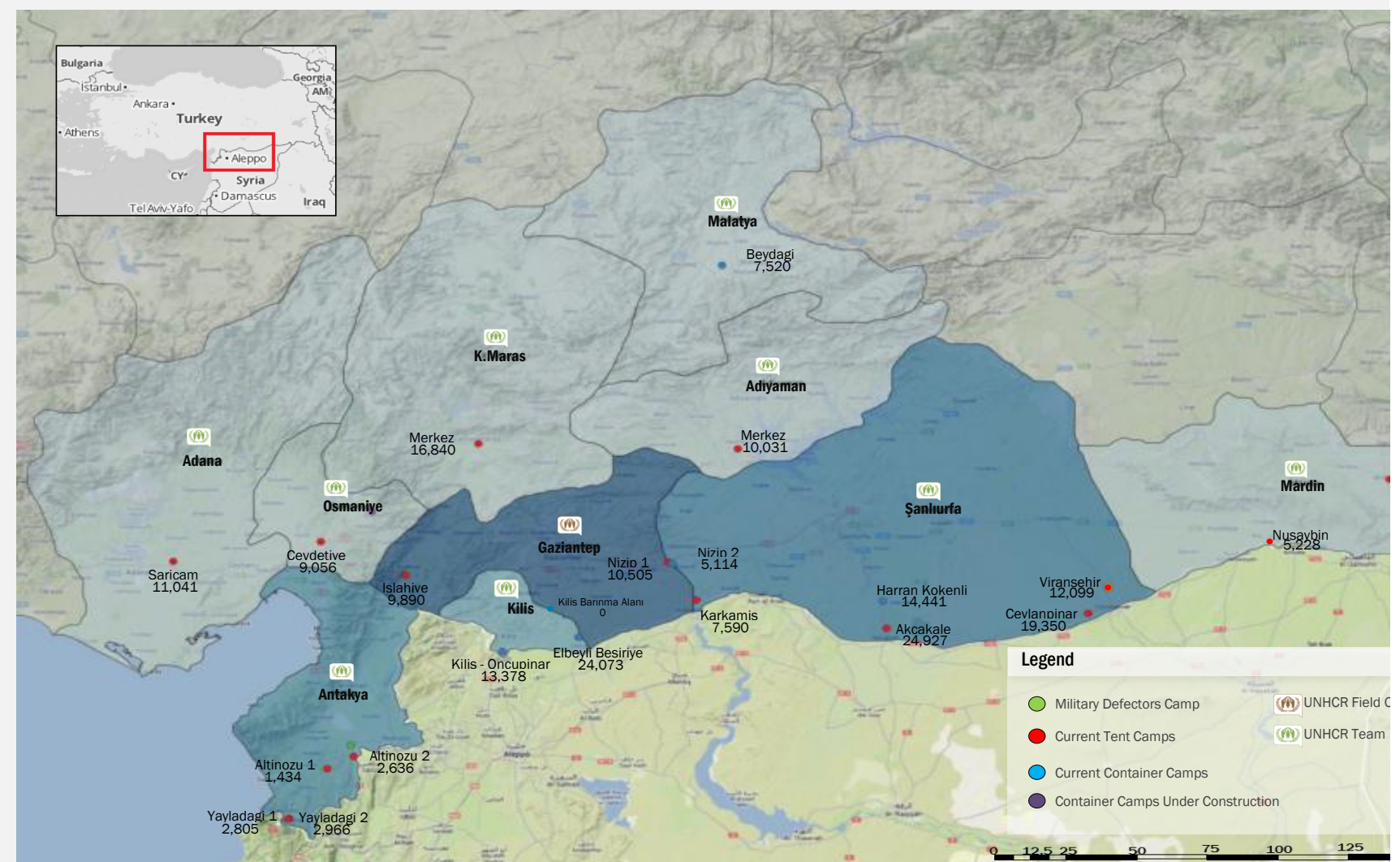


### Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 24 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,731. AFAD reported that during the period of 23-24 July 2014, a total of 375 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 399 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis, the police continue to register non-camp Syrians in two mobile coordination centers. During a visit to one of the mobile coordination centers, a UNHCR team was informed that GDMM has appointed two staff who are observing the registration process currently conducted by police. The police reported that they are registering about 130 persons on a daily basis.
- As of 25 July, 2014 about 46,450 non-camp Syrians living in Kilis province have been registered by the police. The police reported that as they are registering all Syrians, they have already completed the registration of 200 Palestinian-origin Syrians who were given appointments. During a visit to the coordination center, a UNHCR team observed the registration of a group of nine Palestinian single individuals, all of whom had official documents issued in Syria, proving they are Palestinians from Syria.
- The UNHCR Protection Officer and a community services team facilitated a workshop on working with refugees for 12 staff members working at the Yuva community centre in Kirikhan, Hatay province. The focus was on key principals of international protection, the temporary protection regime in Turkey, identifying vulnerable groups, code of conduct and the national referral mechanisms for women and children.
