## Sector highlights from July

#### WASH:

- UNHCR have received US\$ 2million from the UAE to implement an interim ٠ wastewater management project in Zaatari camp. This project is a temporary solution until the installation of the planned wastewater collection network.
- UNICEF and ACTED have finalised the new water distribution and monitoring mechanism for Zaatari camp.
- Distribution of **3,800M<sup>3</sup> of water** is ongoing every day (06:00-18:00)
- De-sludging of **1,800M<sup>3</sup> of wastewater** is ongoing everyday
- Collection of **750M<sup>3</sup> of solid waste** is ongoing everyday
- The handover of WASH facilities to WASH committees is complete. There are currently 364 operational WASH facilities in the camp
- UNICEF and Mercy Corps have signed a contract for installation and operation of a third borehole to be located in district 6.
- JEN have finished disinfecting 312 public water tanks in districts 3, 4, & 5. ٠
- Construction of the onsite wastewater treatment units has now started.

### **PROTECTION:**

- UNHCR are running a dissemination campaign on the new bail-out procedures for refugees.
- Child Protection partners are currently evaluating the quality of CP services provided by partners.
- The drop-in centre for children at the gate is still pending approval from NRC

### **NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFIs):**

- The following items were distributed in July: 25 June-7 July: ACTED and NRC teams distributed **soap and sanitary napkins** targetting the entire camp population. Betweeen the 10-20 July NRC will distributed diapers targeting 7,450 babies.
- The following items will be distributed in August: WASH kits and diapers.

#### **HEALTH:**

- There was a notable decrease in consultations during Ramadan.
- The Health, Water and Sanitation committee of the Ministry of Health visited the camp.
- All health facilities are operational with no outbreaks of disease reported. •
- Sixth round of **polio vaccination campaign** will start in mid-August. .
- New arrivals of the war wounded is on-going. .

#### **EDUCATION**

- Zaatari schools are now closed for the summer break. Education partners in the camp will start remedial education and summer activities from the 22 June in the 3 schools. Schools restart on 24 August.
- There were 4 students from Zaatari who passed the Tawjihi exams completed in June, 3 students of which were ranked the **top achievers in** Mafrag Governorate.
- There are 800 students registered for catch-up classes but only 400 are regularly attending.
- UNHCR have received a high number of **DAFI scholarship applications**.

## FOOD:

- The second distribution cycle of July reached 80,000 beneficiaries. ٠
- WFP and Save the Children have finished monthly in-kind food distribution cycles and have shifted to food vouchers only. Vouchers are distributed twice a month in 8-day cylces with a value of 10JD. Super-cereal has been distributed during the second cycle, each family received 1.5KG.
- WFP distributed re-useable shopping bags to beneficiaries.

## Statistics from 10-16 August 2014

 A total of 52 individuals were transferred from Raba Sarhan to Zaatari camp. • Dara is the main city of origin for refugees transferred from Raba Sarhan to Zaatari (49%) – see chart below.



 A total of 22 individuals were transferred from Azrag camp to Zaatari for family reunification purposes.

• A total of 3 individuals were transferred from EJC camp to Zaatari for family reunification purposes.

• 92 new born babies were registered, among them (41%) girls and (59%) boys. A total of **701 Individuals spontaneously departed** to Syria including 36% living in Zaatari and 64% outside Zaatari. Dara is the main city where refugees departed to (94%), followed by Rural Damascus (8%), Homs (1%).
