Why a refugee component?

- **Refugees are among the most vulnerable of the populations in Lebanon, Turkey, Jordan, Turkey and Egypt on all measures:**
 - **Protection, including child protection and SGBV**
 - **Shelter**
 - **Education**
 - **Food security**
 - **Health**
 - **Access to sustainable and safe water sources and sanitation**
 - **Poverty and meeting basic needs**
 - **Social cohesion**

Resilience: What? What not? Why?

- **What:**

Recover from, cope with, and transform – both refugees and host communities

- **What Not?**

1. Development and resilience are not synonymous
2. Not just institutional capacity building
3. Simplistic

- **Why?**

1. Adds a sustainability lens to our interventions
2. Supports Equity – Human Rights perspective
3. Builds social coherence
4. Responds to stakeholders demands

Components

Refugee protection and humanitarian assistance component (the Refugee Component):

Will address the protection and assistance needs of refugees living in camps, settlements and local communities in all sectors, as well as vulnerable members of impacted communities. It will strengthen community-based protection by identifying and responding to immediate support needs of communal services in impacted communities.

Resilience and Stabilization component (the Resilience Component):

Will assist impacted communities to cope with and recover from the refugee crisis in all sectors. It will build the capacities of household, communities and national systems that have been impacted by the crisis, and provide the strategic, technical, and policy support to advance national responses.

3RP Goals

Refugee Component

1. **Refugee women, girls, boys, and men fleeing the Syrian conflict have access to effective protection.**
2. **Refugees and the most vulnerable among the impacted population are provided with life-saving and immediate assistance, including in camps and host communities.**
3. **The most vulnerable impacted communities benefit from immediate support to strengthen communal services to support community-based protection.**

Resilience Component

4. The most vulnerable impacted households and communities benefit from interventions that enhance their capacities and resources to cope with and recover from the crisis.
5. Refugees and members of impacted communities have opportunities to progressively build self-reliance.
4. The capacities of sub-national and national delivery systems are strengthened to meet the protection, assistance and social services needs of refugees and members of impacted communities.

Guiding questions

Guiding questions

- What goals is the activity serving?
- Who is benefiting?
- Intervention level? (household, community, institutional)
- Other categorizations? (own, RRP6, partners)
- How can we build coherence? (one objective multiple outputs)
- How is it aligned with national priorities/plans?

Example: Health

Sector: HEALTH Examples

Objective one: *Access to quality comprehensive primary health care services is improved for refugees and vulnerable host communities*

Objective one indicator: *# of functional basic health units/ 10,000 population*

Output 1.1 Syrian refugees have improved access to Primary Health Care services camps

Example Activities

- Xx PHC equipped and supported to provide services to refugees in camps

Output 1.2 Access to Primary Health Care services in community settings is improved

Example Activities

- Build and equip xx clinics in the community
- Staff recruitment in government PHC facilities

Output 1.3 Refugees have access to support schemes to enable access to essential health services

Example Activities

- Health Insurance to assist Syrians to access health care
- Support participation and transport costs to PHC for refugees

Example: Health (cont'd)

Objective Two: National Health Care System capacity is reinforced to provide services for refugees and vulnerable populations

Objective two indicator: Number of health workers per 10,000 population

Output 2.1 The quality of health services improved in refugee camps and areas with high refugee influx

Example Activities

- Training of xx primary health care staff on trauma for Syrians refugees

Output 2.2 Quality of tertiary health services improved for refugees and impacted populations

Example Activities

- Training of xx tertiary health staff on xx
- Xx centres for disabilities in referral hospitals reinforced

Objective Three: *Ensure children are vaccinated against measles and polio*

Objective three indicator: % of children fully immunized (disaggregated by refugees, impacted communities and other target groups)

Output 3.1 Children under five are vaccinated against polio nationwide

Example Activities

- xx children under five reached through national polio vaccination campaigns

Output 3.2 Reinforce routine Expanded Programme of Immunization through the health system in priority areas of refugee influx

Example Activities

- Improved cold chain in PHC
- Training of PHC personnel
