


Inside Syria UNICEF is scaling up Whole of Syria operations to respond to the recent escalation of conflict and displacement, with the response from all three operational hubs. In Aleppo, operations include water trucking to 4,000 people in Haramain camp and Azaz city, and health and nutrition supplies were pre-positioned in eastern Aleppo city. In Dara city UNICEF has provided emergency health kits for 35,000 people in 6 clinics and hygiene kits for 45,000 people.

In the countries hosting Syrian refugees UNICEF programmes have supported over 53,000 families with multi-purpose cash assistance across Jordan and Iraq. A further 18,300 people in Turkey received emergency cash or cash-voucher assistance to meet their needs over the cold winter months.

In Lebanon between December 2015 and January 2016, 90,000 Syrian refugee children in informal settlements received one-time USD 40 winter cash grant.


Water

In Syria, UNICEF is providing support to operations and maintenance of water and sanitation systems to serve over **13 million** people on a regular basis.

#population served by support to repair/rehabilitation/augmentation of water and sanitation systems

Syria **8% of target 4,6 million**

In neighboring countries, **98,157** people have been provided with access to drinking and domestic water.



Child Protection

There are over **930,000** children targeted for psychosocial support services in 2016, to date **83,700** children have benefited from these services.





In Syria, UNICEF supported **16,925** child in formal education through distribution of supplies/textbooks.

Health


There are over **19 million** children targeted with polio vaccination in 2016, mainly through campaigns**.

No campaigns have been conducted in Syria up till now.


However **2,688 children** have been immunized in Jordan and Iraq through local vaccination activities.

Funding Status per Country - % Funded




Funding Status per Sector - % Funded
