Outcomes of prioritization exercise Engaging Men and Boys in SGBV programing;	 Based on the prioritization exercise conducted in the last meeting on June 16, the highest scores were for: mapping organizations currently working with men and boys to introduce prevention programming; sensitizing staff to better understand gender equality concepts and how it impacts masculinity; ensuring that service providers are trained to provide services for men and boys, not only women and girls Suse Prosser (CRP) offered to be the focal point for the work on "Engaging with Men and Boys". The Youth Peer Education network, supported globally and in Jordan by UNFPA, made a presentation on their work. This network consists of Jordanian youth but also open to all nationalities. Follow-up of SRSG on Sexual Violence in Conflict mission: strategy and funding exercise;	 As requested through the RCO in follow up to the SRSG SVC mission to the Region, the SGBV SWG has been requested to produce a 2-year SGBV strategy and a mapping of available funding and funding gap. Members broke into groups and revised the 2013 SGBV SWG strategy document, providing inputs, in line with the SGBV SWG 2015 Action Plan and Protection Strategy, to the 2015-2017 Strategy. Agencies are requested to provide their financial inputs (funds available and funding gaps) by Tuesday 21st July COB.

- Reconciliation office: A team visit was conducted in Zaatari to establish this office. This will be followed by site planning.

GBVIMS

- A GBVIMS mission from Geneva took place in June. The mission consisted of 2 components: one targeting members of the task force and aiming at improving data analysis competencies, including for the development of GBVIMS reports. The other leg of the mission was a 1-day GBVIMS refresher training targeting case managers.
- Agencies will be given another 2 weeks to provide their inputs.
- Results of the mapping will be shared at the next meeting.
