


Over the hot summer months UNICEF is continuing to provide a water, sanitation and hygiene response in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Irag. In Syria UNICEF, with sector partners, is supporting water access in areas where control of water is increasingly being used in the war in Damascus, Rural Damascus, Aleppo and Dara governorates. UNICEF is providing water trucking, rehabilitation of wells and fuel to power systems. In Aleppo city, where water access has been dramatically reduced particularly for populations in collective shelters and populations further from piped water networks, water trucking is supporting 300,000 people. In Jordan in the last month UNICEF and partners have handed over a water system to improve water access for over 500,000 people.

Despite the fact that UNICEF has recieved 55% of the funds required for the humanitarian response inside Syria and to Syrian refugees in neighbouring countries, further funding is required to meet the needs with vulnerabilities continuing to increase across the region.



#### 2015 UNICEF Results

#### Water

In Syria, UNICEF is providing water treatment supplies that treat enough water to serve over 16.55 million people on a regular bases. UNICEF also provides targeted support to water systems:

### Syria 135% of target 3.5 million

In neighboring countries, 1,017,022 people have been provided with access to drinking and domestic water.

### Child Protection

There are over 820,000 children targeted for psychosocial support services in 2015, to date 447,138 children have benefited from these services.




## **Education**

In Syria, UNICEF supported access to formal education for 13,017 students through school rehabilitation, pre-fabricated classrooms and school bursaries.

In neighbouring countries, 344,186 refugee children have been supported to enroll in formal education.

# Health


5,051,986 children vaccinated against polio as of Junel 2015.

There are over 20 million children targeted with polio vaccination in 2015, mainly through campaigns\*\*. Three campaigns have been conducted in Syria reaching 2,989,659 children under five with immunization and 2,062,327 children have been immunized between Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq. Nine campaigns have been conducted in the sub-region so far this
