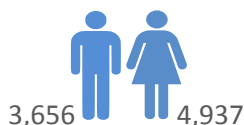
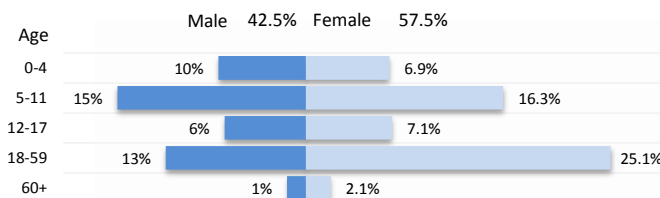

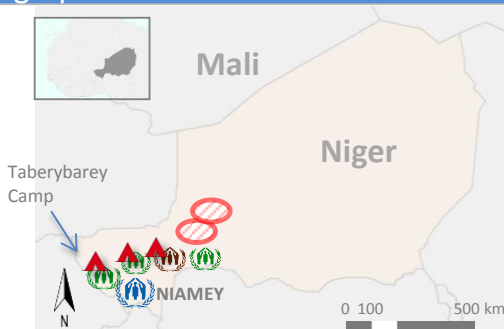

Context

History In May 2012, Tabareybarey camp received refugees who were relocated from Mbeidoum and Gaouel spontaneous refugee sites situated at the border. The camp has a capacity to host 10,000 people. In April 2013, UNHCR and the Government launched the "Safety Net" programme in the camp with a view to offer a durable solution for Nigeriens who fled the violence in Mali and live alongside Malian refugees in the camp.

Protection Issues

Refugee women are under-represented in the community structures

Lack of birth certificates for newborns

Low enrolment rate of girls in school

Incidence of sexual violence

Ethnic tension in camps

Conflict over resources with host communities

Forced and early marriages

Protection Responses

Women platform was formed to encourage their participation in community structures

A mobile court was introduced to issue birth certificates

Involvement of the of marabouts and communities leaders as key actors

Prevention and response mechanisms with SOPs are established

Co-existence and peace-building programmes are introduced

Host communities are included in the water and health assistance

Targetted awareness campaigns for men, adolescents and families were introduced
