Cohorts - children sensitized

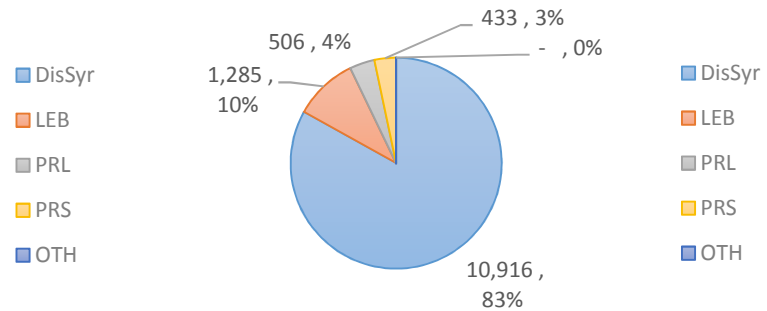

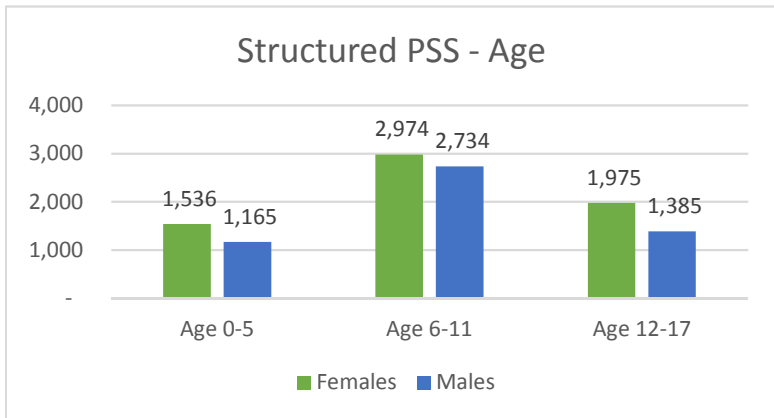
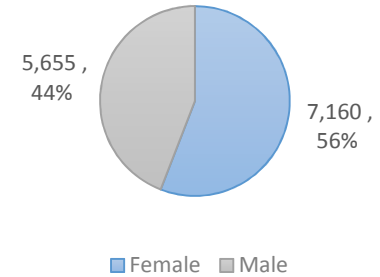
Cohorts - Structured PSS

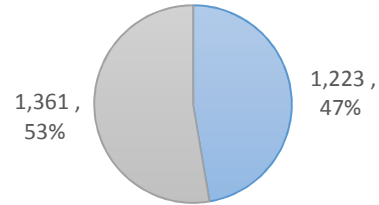

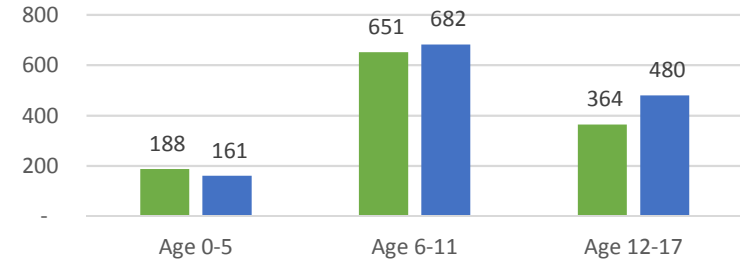

Focused PSS - Sex



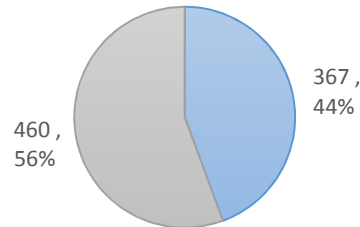
Focused PSS - Age



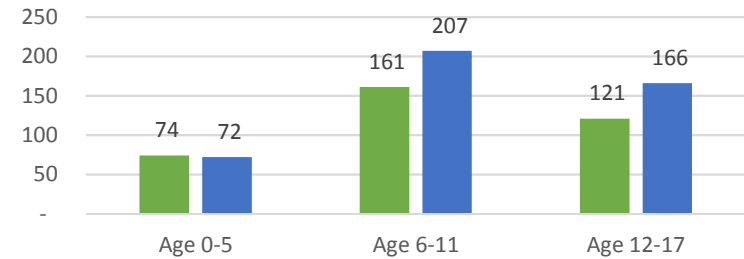

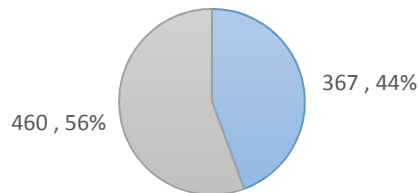

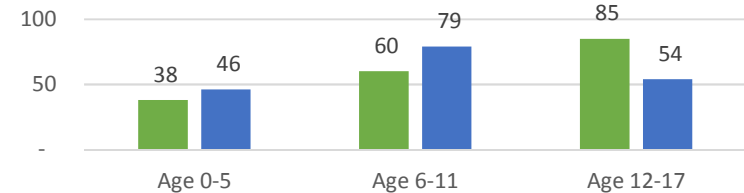
