EXPLANATORY NOTES:

SUMMARY:

This matrix is prepared and published monthly, representing what happened in various sectors in the particular reference month. This indicators matrix is a step towards showing a comprehensive picture of the current situation in Gambella region and establishing a basis for initial trend and gap analysis. In order to better understand the matrix, following are the explanatory notes on some of the sector indicators:



NUTRITION:

- Performance indicators for Tierkidi, Kule, Pugnido 2 and Okugo are within sphere standards with curate >75%, defaulter rate <15%, death rate < 10% for OTP and <3% for TSFP. In Pugnido the OTP cure rate is below the sphere standards due to a high referral and defaulter rate of 20% and 14% respectively
- Increase in admission due to onset of malaria season as well as resumption of the nutrition services in Jewi camp by ARRA in the interim.



SHELTER:

- The % of households in emergency family shelter indicates the need for continuous shelter intervention in all the camps.
- 'Transitional shelters' refers to those that have been completed with mud plastering.
- Transitional Shelter Construction has commenced in Kule, Tierkidi, Jewi., Pugnido I and II



WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH):

- Supply of safe water maintained within the sphere standards in all the camps during the month of July 2016 except Tierkidi where it has been averaging at 11 liters per person per day. In kule the daily per capita water supplied in liters per person day averaged at 15.5 L/P/D, Jewi 15.3 L/P/D, Pungido 16.8 L/P/D, Pugnido-2 16 L/P/D and Okugo 19.2LPD.
- The number of persons per tap was also kept within sphere standards for Kule (206) Tierkidi, (228), Pungido (119), Okugo (80), Jewi 169 and Pugnido-2 (120)
- The number of refugees per latrine stance was 44 for Okugo, 9 for Kule, 16 for Tierkidi, 12 for Jewi, 44 for Pugnido 2 and 27 for Old Pugnido.
- The number of refugees per hygiene promoter was 520 for kule, 1304 for Tierkidi, 1396 for old Pungido, 1,038 for Pugnido2, and 448 for Jewi and 830 for Okugo. There is an improvement in Jewi, for other camps the same for the previous months.



EDUCATION:

- Gross Enrolment rate in at preschool is still very low at 37%. Reasons for low enrolment mentioned by parent are: Inability of schools to provide a feeding programme for the children; Accessibility to preschools; Lack of proper awareness on the importance of early childhood education for children; Security reasons; and children not interested in Early Childhood Care and development activities. Partners are continuously mobilizing parents to escort children to ECCD centres and there has been reassurance of protection on the way to the centres.
- The pupil /facilitator ratio is at 84 for preschool and 90 for primary school, way above the recommended standards of 30. Due to funding challenges, partners have been unable to meet this crucial indicator at the required standard.
- The Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) at primary education is 63% which is slightly above the average.
- Secondary education remains low despite construction of secondary school in Kule and Tierkidi, however the ongoing construction of secondary school in Jewi, is likely to improve the enrollment rate slightly above the 7 percent.
- class room attendance improved as a result of the on going construction of semi permanent and permanent classrooms



HEALTH:

Mortality: Crude and Under 5 mortality rates have been within the SPHERE standards for several months. Good case management by partners for diseases such as severe malaria, dehydration secondary to diarrhea and complications of severe malnutrition contributed to reduction in mortality. Strengthened surveillance and other disease prevention efforts have contributed to early case detection and treatment. However, it is worth noting that all mortality that occurred in some camps may not have been reported and reduced the mortality indicators.

Morbidity indicators

Diarrhea: The incidence of diarrheal diseases remained high in all refugee camps due to multiple factors including inadequate water supply, lower latrine coverage and poor hygiene practice. Heavy rains also worsen sanitation situation in the camps as latrines are filled with water and overflowed into water collections where children can go for playing.

Malaria: Malaria incidence rates have increased in all refugee locations and Kule was the only location being affected the most with crude incidence of 133.2 cases/1000 population. The malaria prevention and control effort such as mosquito net distribution was undertaken back in 2015 and now vulnerable groups such as children under 5 years of age and pregnant women are receiving mosquito bed nets in all camps. environmental management such as bush clearing around home environment was done to reduce mosquito breeding near homes.

Vaccination:

No arrival vaccination has been conducted at the entry points since there has been no new arrivals crossing the border.
