Organization Updates, Announcements	IFH announced that it added 2 more clinics to their pre-established 19 locations. One in Al-Quawaysmeh, Amman and one in Karak. Both sites are supported by UNFPA. The clinics will be providing case management, psychosocial support and reproductive health services in the new sites to the survivors of SGBV.		
Standing Updates: Situation at Border, Urban Verification	<p>Berm Situation: There is no direct access to the asylum seekers in both Ruqbaan and Al-Hadalaat. The negotiations for the provisions of food are ongoing. UNFPA highlighted that they procured about 900 plus dignity kits for disbursement at Berm. Agencies to contact UNFPA if service and supplies provision to Berm is approved by the authorities.</p> <p>Urban Verification: The Urban Verification exercise is still ongoing; a major drop in the monthly cards issuance rate was noticed (from 24000 to 10000 cards per month).</p>	<p>Agencies to contact Fatma Khan fkhan@unfpa.org if they can distribute dignity kits to Berm.</p> <p>Organization who come across cases that denied access to school report to UNICEF to explore solutions.</p>	UNFPA, UNICEF
Clinical Management of Rape (CMR)	As part of the joint project of UNFPA, UNHCR and UNICEF a consultant is at present engaged in developing the National Protocol for the Clinical Management of Rape (CMR) in Jordan under the leadership of National Council for Family Affairs (NCFA). As per SGBV-SWG's request, the draft of the protocols will be shared with the group for comments and feedback by the end of the year. The protocols will be rolled out in 2017. GBVIMS Annual Report	<p>The Annual Report of the GBVIMS of 2015 was shared with the SGBV-SWG member. The sector coordinators outlined the key findings, patterns, challenges, sector linkages and recommendation of the report. 	on the continuity of the trends and similar findings encountered every six months.		
JRP Update and Next Steps: Inter-sector Coordination Unit	Senior Inter-Sector Agency coordinator gave members a briefing about the Jordan Response Plan (JRP) process. The 3 rd phase of the JRP is related to the 3RP (Regional Refugee Resilience) plan, JRP is the Jordan chapter of the 3RP and have an interagency appeal that is a fund raising activity for UN agencies and NGOs. Since it a rolling plan, the sectors will be invited to contribute in the 2017-2019 planning phase. At present there is no official instruction issued by the GoJ about the involvement of the sectors in the planning phase. However, the dates will be communicated as soon as the government makes a decision. The Protection Working Group (PWG) will be working closely with MoSD in the JRP social protection Taskforce. PWG members are expected to review the strategy and the logical framework to ascertain if it is still valid for the current planning period and make recommendations accordingly. JRP SGBV Progress Update and Gaps Identification	Where are we now, where are we going? Gaps in 2016, lessons and priorities for 2017? Sector coordinator presented an extraction of the data that was reported on Activity Info for the SGBV key indicators (Progress against the Target). The salient gaps of reporting from 2016 was discussed. The biggest gap was observed in the area of the reporting of sensitization and training interventions. Sector coordinator emphasized on the importance of reporting on monthly basis with a precise data as it has a major impact on the upcoming JRP/3RP planning phases.
