




The annual inflation in the overall food price index remains above the average rate for 2012-2015 (12.4%). The food price inflation peaked in August with 20.2% and decreased in September and October to 14.4% while soaring for sub groups, such as oil (27.5%) and sugar (28.7%). This increase in food prices is reflected in the cost of the minimum expenditure food basket for Syrian refugees which increased to EGP 350 (USD 19) in December, compared to EGP 213 (USD 11.7) during February 2016. On 03 November the Egyptian currency was floated and WFP is closely monitoring the development.

Due to the delay in re-financing the emergency operation funds, WFP did not start with the implementation of livelihood activities planned under the protracted relief and recovery operation (PRRO). WFP, however, is preparing the PRRO activities. WFP held a series of meetings with potential NGO partners to discuss beneficiary targeting for the PRRO livelihood activities and the challenges facing implementation of these activities. WFP is coordinating meetings with the private sector (textile, furniture and aesthetics) for the opportunities of on the job training for refugees under

**113,000** Syrian Refugees expected by end-2017




**376,522** Refugees & Local Community Members Sectoral Target by end of 2017




**3RP 2017 Funding Status**


