

Since December 2016, more than 134,000 individuals internally displaced by drought have arrived in the town of Baidoa or its outskirts contributing to the increase of the IDP population to approximately 169,000 individuals (*28,000 households multiplied by a factor of 6). The map above may not include all IDP sites so the true figure may be higher.

The Protection & Return Monitoring Network (PRMN) is a UNHCR-led project which identifies and reports on displacements of populations and protection incidents in Somalia. At the beginning of April 2017, Norwegian Refugee Council (the partner organization implementing the PRMN) mapped the main IDP sites in and around Baidoa recording top-line population figures and coordinates. The map above includes 20 new sites identified in the week ending 28 April 2017.

For comparison, South West State of Somalia MoRDA published (3 May 2017), a list of 195 IDP settlements in Baidoa with a count of 30,805 households (PRMN's figure is 9% lower which may result from differing methodologies, dates or locations).
