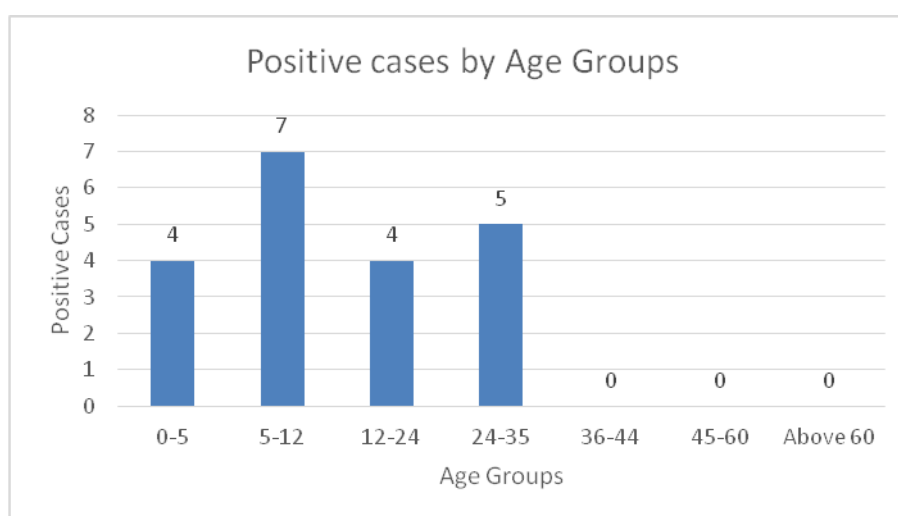
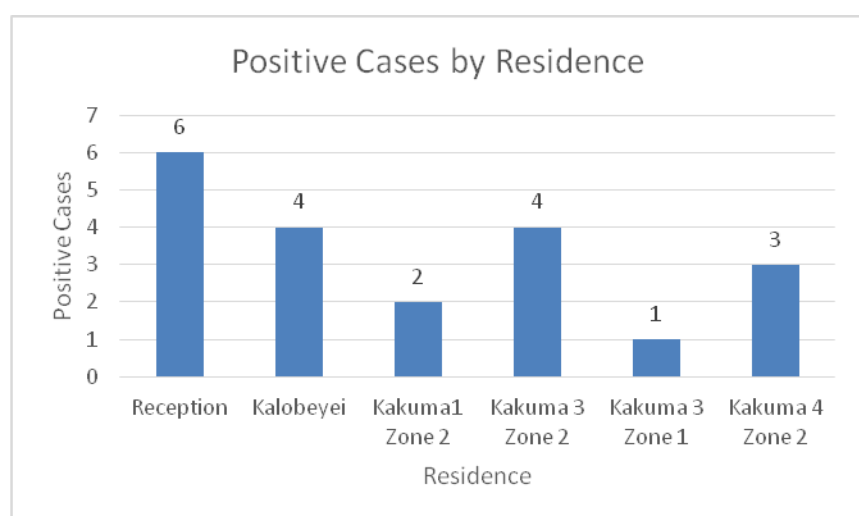
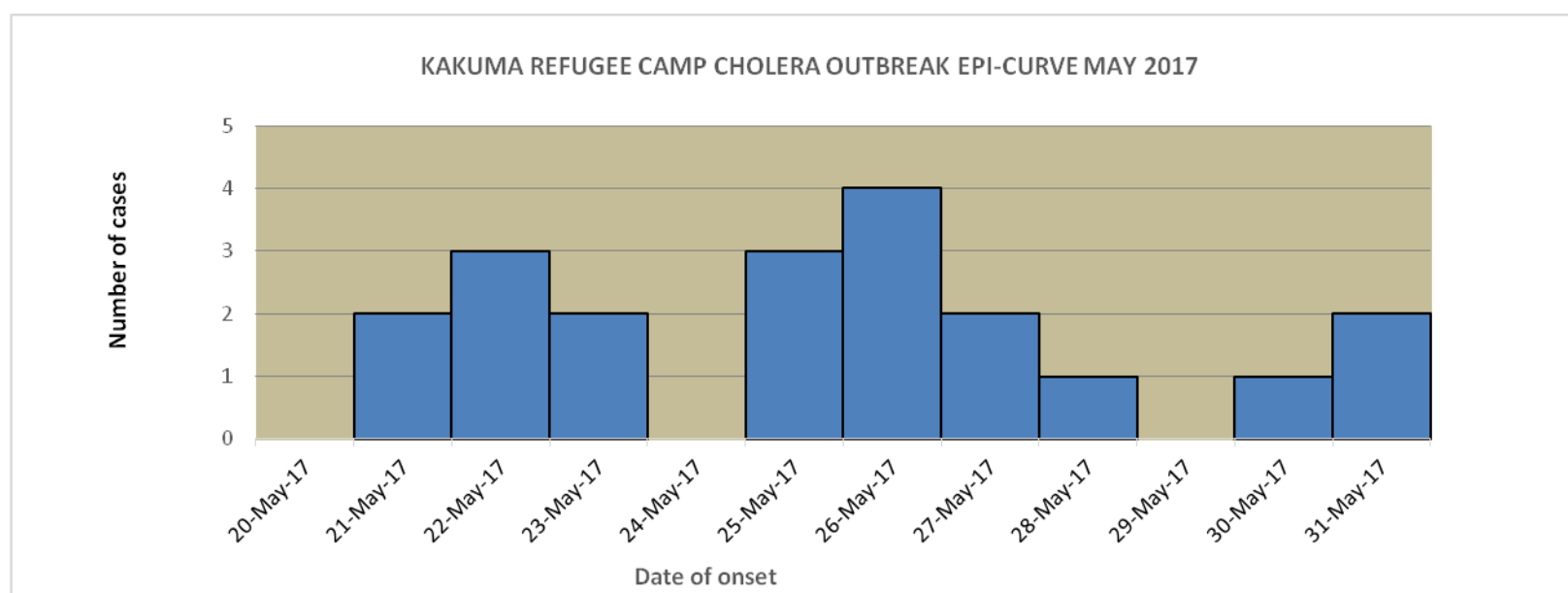

1. Highlights

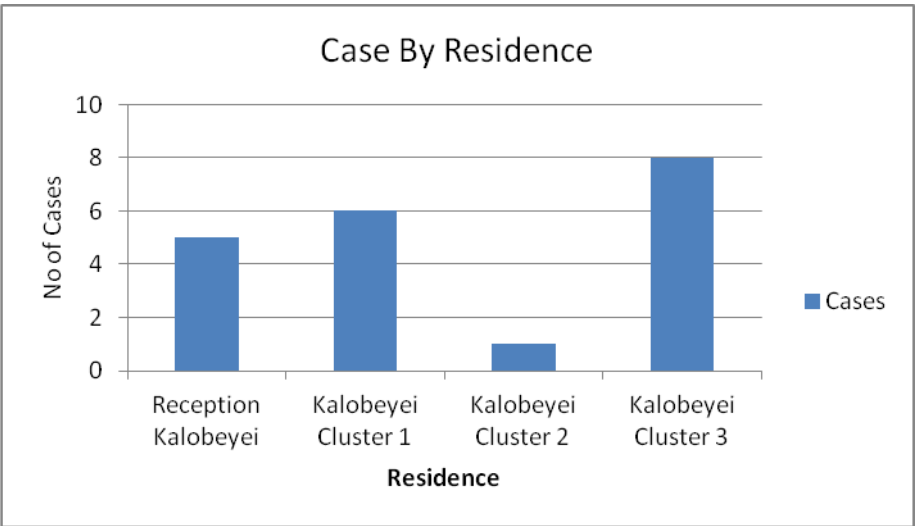
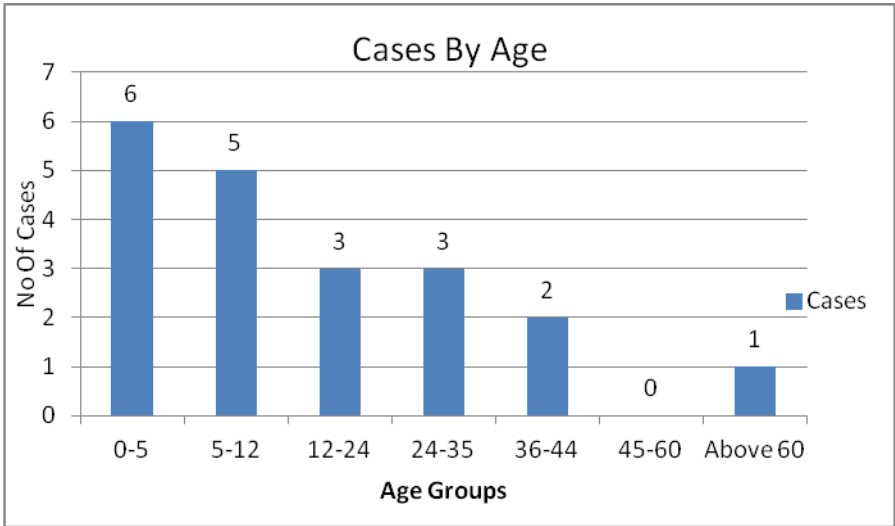
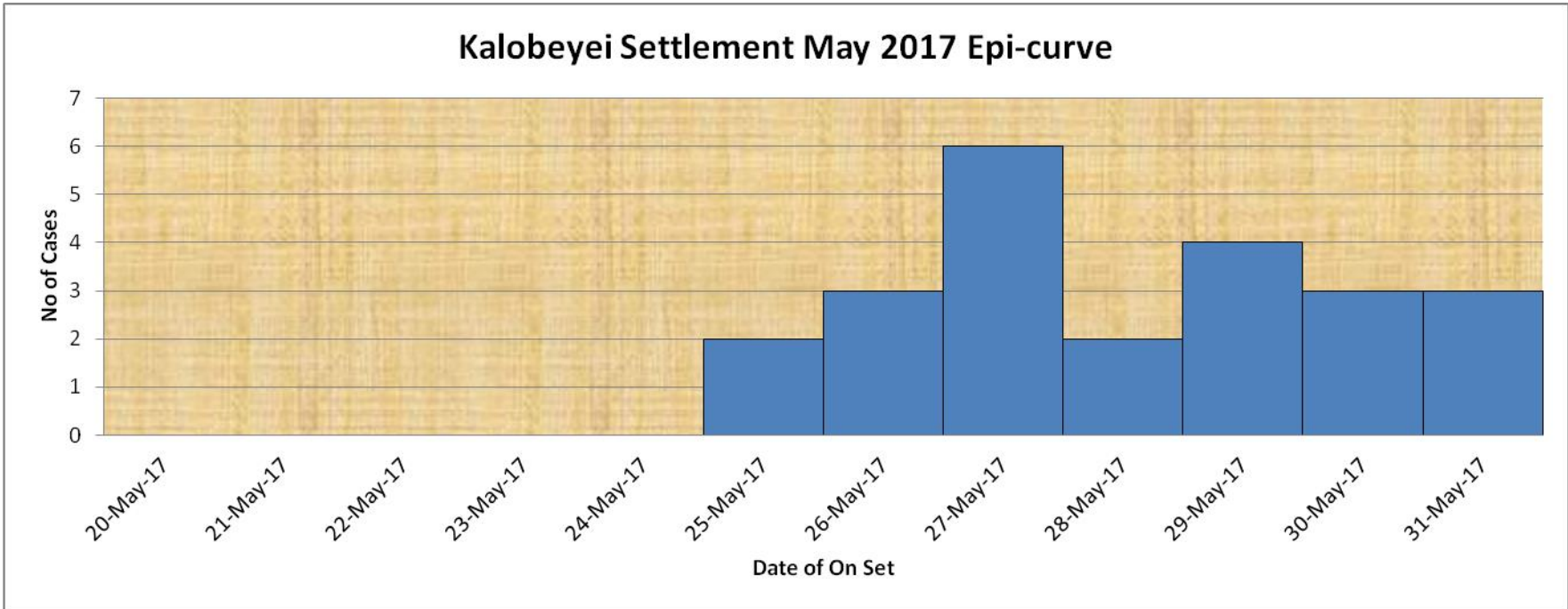
- Cholera outbreak ongoing with the first confirmed case identified on 22nd May 2017.
- A total of 3 samples already confirmed for Vibrio Cholerae inaba 01
- 58 Patients currently lined up. 38 in Kakuma and 20 in Kalobeyi.
- 2 CTCs operational with
 - a) Kalobeyi CTC - 7 patients currently admitted.
 - b) Kakuma 4 CTC - 2 patients currently admitted
- No mortality reported to date.

1. Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

Water

NRC is the main WASH implementing partner In Kakuma and Kalobeyei. Other operational WASH partners are Team & Team and World Vision International-Kenya.

Kakuma

Average water supply in Kakuma is 21litres pppd

- Extra pipeline done in Kakuma 1 Zone 2 increase water supply to tap stands. Currently 4 of the 5 tap stands in the zone are currently working.
- Repair of all broken taps and nozzles ongoing in Kakuma1 Zone 2 , Kakuma 3 and Kakuma 4.
- Connection of CTC in Kakuma 4 with a direct line completed to ensure continuous running water.
- Repair of pumping system in borehole 15 complete increasing availability of water in Kakuma.
- An additional elevated steel tank in kakuma 1 connected to bore hole 3 and ready for use.
- Water distribution timetable changed in Kakuma 4 aimed at making water more accessible. Close monitoring with household surveys to establish effectiveness of change

Kalobeyei

- Population in Kalobeyei currently receiving 12 litres pppd.
- Kalobeyei divided into three Clusters. Cluster 1 currently connected piped water while cluster 2 & 3 rely on trucked water from Cluster 1.
- An extra elevated still tank connected to water in Cluster 1 on that will ensure the reception centre in kalobeyei has continuous supply of piped water.
- Connection of T-joints done in cluster 3 from the main pipe with the same anticipated to start in cluster 2.
- 4” inch pipes mobilised in cluster 3 to connect the households to piped water from the main pipe.

- Excavation of 2,542 meters done to lay pipeline in cluster 2&3 so as to provide piped water.

Sanitation

Kalobeyei

- 10 additional communal latrines done in Kalobeyei cluster 3.
- Joint identification with shelter team of areas where new arrivals will be settled done so as to put sanitation facilities.

Kakuma

- Two house hold latrines done for contacts of cholera patients who had sold previous latrine materials.
- Decontamination done in kakuma 3&4 of latrines of contacts admitted in kakuma 4 CTC last two days.

Hygiene Promotion

Kalobeyei

- Two hand washing facilities put up at the Kalobeyei reception centre.
- Decision to put leaky 5 litre jerrican in all latrines at the reception centre with 0.02% chlorine done as handwashing facilities.
- Disinfection of latrines and homes of contacts of cholera patients ongoing in Cluster 1,2&3.
- Increased Hygiene promotion messaging ongoing at the reception center in Kalobeyei.

Kakuma

- Increased hand washing and hygiene promotion done in schools-Mogadishu schools done yesterday.
- Joint awareness by hygene promoters and community health workers at household level ongoing especially in kakuma 1 3&4
- Temporay latrine construction ongoing in kakuma reception centre.Currently 8 additional latrines are complete.
- Construction of 12 door permanent latrines at kakuma reception centre by Team and Team ongoing.

Cholera Coordination

-Cholerae interagency coordination done on 31.05.2017 with MoH from National,County and Subcounty,UNICEF,CDC,WHO with UNHCR and its Health and WASH implementing and operational partners.Meetings to be held twice a week.

-WASH coordination meeting to be held on 2nd June 2017
