

Monthly Camp Report:

Kyein Ni Pyin

Reporting Period: **March 2015**

The report presents an overview of the situation in the camp, including basic demographic data, infrastructures and access to services as of March 2015. Monthly Highlights

- On 3rd March, WFP international staff discussed with CMC members, FMC members and beneficiaries about the possibility of distributing food vouchers instead of direct food distribution. Most of the IDPs rejected this idea because it is very difficult to find food resources in this camp (there is no market or regular supply). As such, they would prefer to receive general food distribution at this moment.
- On 4th March, the township administrator arrived and discussed about the quarrel within camp residents for football playing. He took action by issuing warning letters to both groups of youths. In addition he discussed about the individual housing for next shelter construction. There were concerns from the IDPs that if they receive the individual houses, they would not get assistance any more. No clear response was given.
- On 19th March, the township administration team and municipal team arrived and met the CMC members and paddy field owners for the individual house construction in the camp. They have a plan to buy the paddy fields because they will construct the new individual housing in those areas. They discussed about the price agreement with the field owners based upon one acre per seven lakh. They have already paid in cash 27 lakh and twenty thousand for 3.30 acre and they will finish the new shelter construction within April 2015.
- The Australia ambassador Mr. Nicholas Coppel arrived and observed the camp situation and discussed with the camp administrators, CMC members and IDPs about their difficulties on 25.3.2015.
