UNHCR visited to camp to know the status situation of shelters and protection and met with CMC, Incentive Workers and IDPs on 8th and 22nd April. Inter-Agency meeting was held on 21st April and participated by 30 (8 Female) representatives from SCI, LWF, CMC and Social Groups.

According to April headcount survey, there are 716 households. LWF already submitted complete headcount survey to UNHCR on 10th April. CMC meeting was held on 8th April and participated by 35 (17 Female) CMC members and incentive workers. UNHCR visited to camp to know the status of shelters and protection issues and met with CMCs, Incentive Workers and IDPs on 8th and 22nd April. Inter-Agency meeting was held on 22nd April and participated by 29 (8 Female) representatives from SI, SCI, LWF, CMC and Social Groups. LWF provided a capacity building training on effective communication, leadership, CRM, and CCCM roles and responsibilities for CMC and Incentive workers on 30th April. There were 35 (17 Women) participants. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> CMC mentioned that IDPs will not accept individual houses that will be provided by Government. They fear agencies will stop their services in the camp as restriction of movement is still in place.
