<b>Shelter</b> UNHCR	UNHCR and CMAs have undertaken with the Government counterpart discussions on shelters' repair and maintenance solutions based on the most updated shelter assessment done in Sittwe camps by the Government. The assessments have highlighted the needs to implement a rapid repair and maintenance prior to rainy season. As discussions are still ongoing, further information will be shared once agreement is made.
