Inter-agency meeting was held on 22th January and 26 (13 Female) representatives from CMC, ACF, LWF, Oxfam, Ward Administrator and social groups participated. LWF/UNHCR completed 1,500 feet long road improvement project under Quick Impact Project (QIP) and handed over to communities and ward administrator on 28th January. Government provided 3 wheeler vehicles to CMC to serve camp population for school transportation and hospital or medical attention purpose. Similarly, Department of Health provided MMK 150,000 for maintenance purpose. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> IDPs asked about the status of plan to construct individual houses. Ward Administrator suggested to form a 5 member committee to follow up and inform the progress of the proposed project regularly.
